1. Purpose of the Policy

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that Stortford Youth Choirs provides a safe, respectful, inclusive, and positive environment where all members can enjoy making music, develop their skills, and feel valued.

This policy sets out the expected standards of behaviour for choir members and outlines the responsibilities of staff, volunteers, parents, and guardians.

2. Who This Policy Applies To

This policy applies to:

- All members of Stortford Youth Choirs
- Choir directors, staff, and volunteers
- Parents and guardians, in supporting their children

3. Core Values

Stortford Youth Choirs is committed to:

- Respect for all individuals
- Kindness, teamwork, and cooperation
- Safety and wellbeing
- Responsibility and commitment
- Inclusivity, equality, and fairness

4. Expected Behaviour of Choir Members

Respect and Conduct

Choir members are expected to:

- Treat fellow singers, staff, and volunteers with kindness and respect
- Listen carefully and follow instructions from choir leaders
- Use appropriate language and behaviour at all times
- Respect differences in ability, background, identity, and beliefs

Participation and Commitment

Choir members should:

- Arrive on time and be ready for rehearsals and performances
- Take part positively and try their best
- Let choir leaders know in advance if they cannot attend
- Take care of music, uniforms, venues, and choir property

Safety

All members must:

- Follow safety instructions given by staff and venue supervisors
- Stay within designated areas during rehearsals, breaks, and events
- Report accidents, injuries, or concerns to a choir leader straight away

5. Unacceptable Behaviour

The following behaviours are not acceptable at Stortford Youth Choirs:

- Bullying, teasing, harassment, or discrimination of any kind
- Physical, verbal, or emotional aggression
- Disruptive behaviour that affects rehearsals or performances
- Inappropriate language, gestures, or materials
- Damage to property or theft
- Possession or use of prohibited items

6. Online and Digital Conduct

When representing Stortford Youth Choirs online or using digital platforms:

- Communicate politely and respectfully
- Do not share personal information without permission
- Do not post photos or videos of others without consent
- Follow choir guidance on social media and digital communication

7. Behaviour Management and Consequences

If a choir member does not meet expected behaviour standards:

1. A reminder or warning will be given
2. Continued concerns may lead to a discussion with the singer
3. Parents or guardians may be contacted
4. Serious or repeated misconduct may result in temporary or permanent removal from Stortford Youth Choirs

All actions will be fair, proportionate, and focused on learning and improvement.

8. Role of Staff and Volunteers

Staff and volunteers will:

- Act as positive role models
- Treat all members fairly and consistently
- Follow safeguarding and child protection procedures
- Address behaviour concerns promptly and appropriately

9. Safeguarding and Welfare

Stortford Youth Choirs is committed to safeguarding the welfare of all children and young people.
