The Black Mountain Community Alliance Board Members are trained and may be available to attend your Community Events with the EZ Child I.D. KIT System, which is for children and adults of all ages.

KEY FEATURES of the EZ Child ID KIT:

- The EZ Child ID KIT includes contact information, digital fingerprints, photos & video interviews
- The EZ Child Computer System scans all 10 fingerprints in a matter of seconds
- The EZ Child Computer creates Child, Adult and Senior ID reports along with two laminated ID Cards & Thumb Drive
- The Child/ Adult/Senior TD contains photos, fingerprint images, videos and age-appropriate crime prevention information
- The Medical ID captures vital prescription drug information and phone numbers for doctors
- **ALL FILES ARE PERMANENTLY DELETED AND FORMS SHREDDED AFTER EACH INDIVIDUAL SESSION SO THAT ONLY THE PARENTS, INDIVIDUALS, OR CAREGIVERS HAVE THE PERSONAL INFORMATION**
