SANSKAAR - TWO MEANINGS

The word Sanskaar has two meanings. The first meaning is that of Sacrament, an outer ceremonial act with inner grace. There are sixteen such Vedic Sacraments. The second meaning of Sanskaar is latent, subliminal impression.

Any act performed with any of the active and cognitive senses is recorded as a Sanskaar, an impression, on the nervous system of the individual. It compares to the way we save a file on a hard disk found in the CPU (Central Processing Unit) of a computer. A human being is what these Sanskaar impressions make of him. In fact, Sanskaars, in their totality, make up the personality of the individual. They are not merely passive traces of a person's past actions but highly dynamic forces that propel consciousness into action; they define his character and cause him to think, speak and act a certain way.

Vaasanaas, on the other hand, are desire-seeds born out of Sanskaars. They act together. Like Sanskaars, they are also embedded deep into a person's nervous system, make up our inner personality and create tendencies to look for, possess and enjoy specific sense-objects. These Vaasanaa-Tendencies determine what type of person we are and what type of inner calling and aptitude we respond to. They bind the individual sturdily to Like and Dislike, Attraction and Aversion. These Vaasanaa-desire-seeds compel Man's actions, forcing him to act in such a way that he becomes trapped in the Cyclic Wheel of Recurring Birth and Death.
