- **4.Security Systems:** Check your home security system by arming and disarming it to ensure proper functioning. Test individual sensors and cameras to ensure they are working and positioned correctly.
- **5.Escape Plans and Routes:** Review and practice fire escape plans with household members, especially children, to ensure everyone knows the evacuation routes and meeting points.
