The Rocky Horror Picture Show (RHPS) was released on September 25, 1975, with music and characters that feature androgynous themes. EarlOrrin Productions, LLC produced the first all African American live shadow cast production of RHPS.

Chocolate Covered Rocky Horror (CCRH) features live vocal performances, innovative choreography, crowd engagement and participation, bringing another dimension to the Rocky Horror shadow cast experience.

Since 2015, CCRH has been a tribute to the queer experience while exposing minorities to liberating art forms.

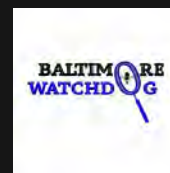
