

Planning a Wedding at Rec Base



Thank you for thinking of us for your wedding venue. Please take some time to look at what we have to offer to determine if it will suit your needs.

Our semi-remote, mostly private property is located off a paved highway, but just before a large forest reserve, accessible by gravel highways. It is a four acre property, fenced with barbed wire, containing a main building (1 bedroom, 2 bath, full kitchen), 2 small cabins (heat and power only) and 1 shop that can be used for an overflow.

Our property has a total of 4 queen beds (one in the shop), 2 double size futons, 1 sofa bed, and 1 air mattress. We say that it **sleeps 14 comfortably**, but this would likely include siblings under 12 that are okay sharing a double bed. Currently, we have two flush toilets and are still hoping to one day add an outhouse.

Our best guess is that with the size of the property and the washrooms available, that our property would comfortably hold **30 people** for a wedding.

We do have a bbq on site as well as one oven, one slow cooker and two fridges. Our oven cooks well, but takes longer than normal to heat up.

We hosted a beautiful wedding in September 2021 for people from Saskatoon, SK. They were able to rent tables and chairs in Saskatoon and bring them with them as well as all of their dishes, lights and decorations. We would recommend that you make arrangements to bring chairs and tables with you, as well as dishes to your liking and think ahead about how you will prepare the meal. We can assist with ideas for you, but our main contribution for the wedding is the simple venue. Currently, our cost for the whole property rental is \$400 a night.

Cautions: we have dandelions a-plenty from mid June to mid July (approximately): which we are hoping to address beginning spring 2026 (to be determined). We have the flies under control with our spraying contact, but they can still be a nuisance outside and then come inside if doors are left open, during autumn.
