TURNING OFF HIGHWAY 591

353084 Range Road 85a is our correct address. Google Map “Rec Base” for location.

Pictured is:

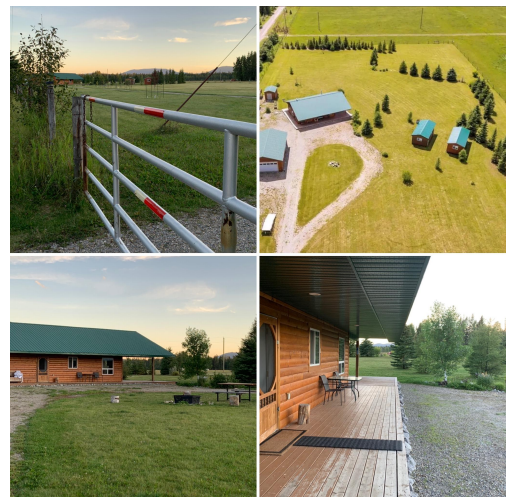
- our turn off the highway,

Off the highway, Boundary Trail is to the right and to the left is Range Road 85a. **Turn left off the highway.**



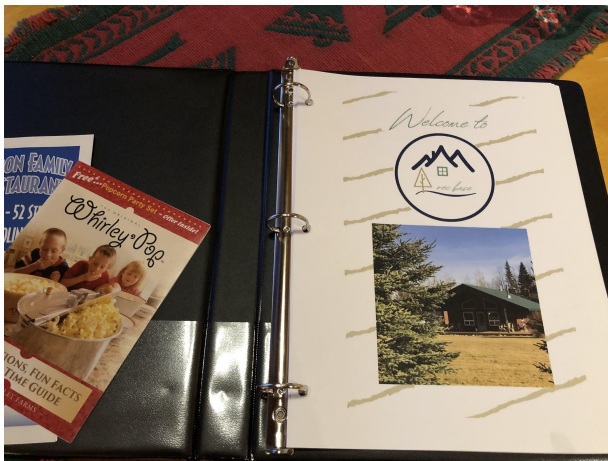
GATE - Once you have arrived at the single gate, unlock the gate with the code given. In this instance the code was 6011, lined up with the top bar of the lock. Please use the code that we gave you.

PARKING - You can either angle park or parallel park at the deck. Please be careful if the deck is wet as it can be quite slippery.





DOOR LOCK - This is the key lock box for the main cabin. In this instance, the code was 1135. Please use the current code we have given you. Push the button with the arrow down to reveal the house key.

KEEP THE CABIN COOL

Hot weather tips:

1. Don't use our ice maker as it doesn't work and we think we have it turned off. It takes about three hours to make the ice in the ice trays provided if you want to stay on top of it.
 2. These ice cube trays are best used by leaving to sit out for about five minutes and then pushing on the bottom of each ice cube to pop it out. If you try to twist the whole tray, it will break.
 3. To keep the cabin cool: Open all the windows when it begins to cool in the evening and maybe leave them open all night and keep the blinds closed on the sunny sides during the day.
 4. Feel free to use the fans.
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WATER THE PLANTS...OR ENJOY IT YOURSELF

We never say no to guests who want to turn the water on to run through or to benefit our plants. Feel free! There are a couple of sprinkler heads to choose from.

FIRE PIT - Please feel free to make use of our outdoor firepit. Roasting sticks are in the bench located just outside the north door.

Advice/Tips:

1. use only a "reasonable" amount of wood
 2. don't use if it is too windy
 3. -ensure your fire is supervised while using and extinguished before you leave it
 4. -visit albertafirebans.ca
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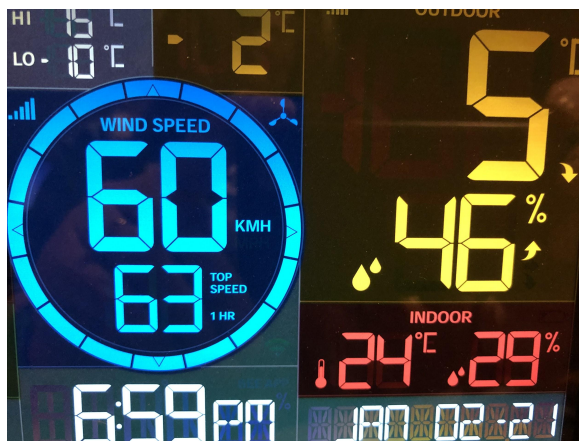




GARBAGE - For longer stays wanting to take out their garbage, or for really smelly garbage at the end of your stay, please bag it all and put it in the garbage can in the playhouse.

We have chosen this location because it is secure, but unlocked. Please make sure that the door is secured before leaving the garbage in there, so that the wild animals/birds won't make a big mess of it.

Do not put your garbage in the burning barrel. Thank you!



WIND - We can get very strong Chinook winds here. If it seems like it will be windy overnight, block the west side door with the white kindling holder, pushing it in tight. This will keep the screen door from banging.

Make sure the deck is clear of items that could get picked up by the wind and cause damage to your vehicles.

Please be very careful with fires and don't have a fire outdoors if the winds are 20 or above.

AUDIO / TV CONNECTION

From top to bottom:

1. Bluetooth audio (blue lit device) connected to indoor and outdoor speakers. This has three modes:
 - a. Radio - we haven't been able to connect this, and have now set it in a spot that the antenna can't be raised in.
 - b. USB
 - c. Bluetooth- easily connect using your phone's settings for Bluetooth. The device name is MOUKEY MAMP 2.
 - d. You can use the tiny remote with this device if you'd like. The system does tend to get quite warm, please remember to turn it off when not in use.
 - e. Speaker Splitter - we also have a speaker splitter for this device, it is just to the right of the little blue lit device. You simply push the buttons to have both speakers on (inside and outside) or just the inside or just the outside.
2. DVD Player - bring some movies to enjoy. Power on, then, using the TV Remote (lower shelf) choose the input setting, Component 1. Now you are set to use the DVD remote (set beside the player) to operate the DVD player.
3. Super Nintendo Entertainment System - Power on, then, using the TV Remote choose the input setting, HDMI. Choose your game and enjoy. There is currently one working extension cord to extend the player remote controller and one regular length cord.
