

Small Cabin Instructions



Access

Whether you have booked one cabin, both cabins, and/or the shop, the keys will be made available to you the day that you have paid to use those buildings. We have a lock box inside the main house that will be left out for you to access with the code we send you on the first paid day.

*If you have paid for the whole time, we will leave the keys hanging below our No Wifi sign inside the door.

Power

We have two sets of breakers, one outside (for both cabins) and inside ones in each cabin. The outside ones will be set to ON for you, but you will need to flip the breakers *inside* your cabin.

Once the breakers are on, you can turn on the heat.

1st Cabin Notes:

This cabin has a built-in heater on the south wall, and unfortunately, the knob has broken off and we are having a hard time replacing it. For now, we are asking guests to flip on the “double-breaker” to power the heater and to flip it off when it’s warm enough, or not in use. You may use the pliers provided to turn the heat down, but it should be set to full power. Please turn the heater off during the day, when the cabin isn’t in use and turn it off before you leave. Night time sleeping is up to you - some like it warm and some like it cool. :-)

There are fairy lights in this cabin. When you turn them on, they will stay on for six hours, unless turned off again. Enjoy!

You are also welcome to turn on the fireplace for an added cozy feeling, the switches for that are below the fire ‘screen’.

There are trees just beside/beyond the second cabin that have Christmas lights strung on them. The blue cord at the side of the second cabin can be plugged into the cabin that has inside power turned on. You may need to press the reset button on the outside plug in if it doesn’t seem to be working. These are quite bright, as they reflect off the snow, and will inhibit any star gazing you may otherwise enjoy. Please unplug these before you leave the property.

2nd Cabin Notes:

The second cabin notes are similar to the first. You can flip the breakers on and then turn on the baseboard heaters. Due to having two baseboard heaters, this cabin can get quite warm. Depending on the outside temperature, you may want to turn them both up to five to warm up the cabin and then turn them both down to two to maintain a comfortable temperature. Please remember to turn off the heat (maybe even switch the breakers off) before you leave the property.
