January 4, 2026, Epiphany Sunday Reflection on the Lord's Prayer.

Dear friends,
After our Christmas and New Year celebrations, we once again turn our hearts and minds to continue our reflections on the theme of prayer. Throughout the year 2025, we reflected on a wide range of topics related to prayer, including its definition and necessity; prayer as an act of love and justice that human beings offer to God; prayer as conversation and covenant; prayer in the lives of prophets, kings, and holy men and women of the Old Testament; the Psalms as prayers in the life of the Church; prayer in the life of Jesus and the Blessed Virgin Mary; as well as the seven forms and seven grades of prayer.

These reflections on the many elements, importance, and characteristics of prayer help us to recognize its true power. Prayer is not meant to be a monotonous repetition of formulas or rituals performed merely for personal spiritual satisfaction. Rather, prayer is fundamentally about a covenantal relationship initiated by God Himself—a relationship through which He desires to remain with us forever. Jesus Christ is the mediator of this profound communion between humanity and the Blessed Trinity. For this reason, Christ stands at the very center of our prayer life. He is our perfect model, and we are called to learn to pray as He prayed, sharing in His desires, trust, and hope.

Therefore, in the coming weeks, we will reflect on the Lord's Prayer, which is the foundation and summary of all Christian prayer. The Fourth Part of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is dedicated entirely to prayer and is divided into two sections. The first focuses on Prayer in the Christian Life (CCC 2558–2758), while the second offers a rich and profound commentary on the Lord's Prayer (CCC 2759–2865). I encourage each of you to take time to read and prayerfully reflect on this commentary.

As we move forward together, let us deepen our understanding of the Lord's Prayer so that we may learn to pray more devoutly and more faithfully according to the heart and desires of Christ Himself. — Fr. Jesu

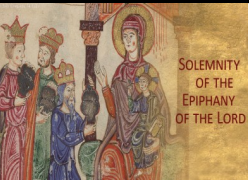

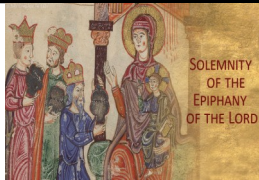
Los Magos “**alzan la vista**” y emprenden un viaje, yendo a donde era lógico “buscar” a un rey, en un palacio. Su llegada causa un poco de alboroto, tanto que el rey Herodes convoca a los sacerdotes y fariseos, los expertos en la Sagrada Escritura. Ellos “saben” que el Mesías nacería en “Belén”. Pero su “saber” no va más allá. No se “levantan”; permanecen seguros y cómodos en el palacio. Los Magos llegan desde lejos; los sacerdotes y fariseos ya están cerca, pero están cegados por su conocimiento, por sus certezas, por sus posiciones privilegiadas.... Parece que Dios se revela a quienes no se regodean en su propia luz, a quienes no buscan los reflectores de la notoriedad. Los Magos emprendieron el camino siguiendo la estrella, pero en cierto momento dejaron de verla. Tan fuerte había sido su certeza de que el Rey recién nacido estaría en el palacio, una certeza que momentáneamente deslumbró sus ojos hasta el punto de que perdieron el rumbo. Pero luego, al aceptar que se habían equivocado, se “convierten” y la estrella reaparece, guiándolos hacia su objetivo. Este es un pasaje hermoso e importante porque nos hace entender que la persona humana nunca es la que cae, la que se equivoca, sino la que se rinde después de caer. Como los Magos, que eran buscadores de la verdad, a veces o a menudo corremos el riesgo de dejarnos deslumbrar por nuestras propias convicciones hasta el punto de perder el rumbo. Hoy, se nos enseña a no tener miedo de cuestionar nuestras propias certezas y conclusiones porque una verdadera “criatura” sabe cómo aceptar sus errores y continuar su camino. Nuestros corazones tienen grandes deseos, sed de justicia y verdad, de alegría y esperanza. Seguir la estrella es seguir esos mismos deseos elevados, nobles, justos y bellos que entran en el corazón y son capaces de movernos a lo largo de la vida, de ponernos en camino sabiendo cómo enfrentar dificultades, riesgos y derrotas, tal como lo hicieron los Reyes Magos. Cuando nuestra búsqueda está impulsada por la verdad, entonces encontramos lo que estamos buscando, *incluso si proviene de un “Niño envuelto en pañales acostado en un pesebre” (Lc. 2:12).* Este pasaje es interesante. No basta con “buscar” si nuestros corazones no son puros, si no están libres de prejuicio, si no están guiados por sentimientos de verdad.

La Epifanía no solo manifiesta a Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, sino que también revela nuestros corazones. Nos muestra que el Salvador puede ser acogido (como sucedió con los pastores y los Magos) y rechazado (como sucedió con el rey Herodes). No ocultemos el hecho de que hay aspectos de “los magos” y aspectos de “el rey Herodes” en cada uno de nosotros. Hay una parte de nosotros ya lista para emprender el camino, para conocer y entender, para crecer y mejorar, para superarnos. Pero también hay un Herodes siempre listo para destruir nuestros sueños y esperanzas. Un Herodes, siempre dispuesto a masacrar, acecha detrás de nuestro deseo de lo bueno, lo bello y lo justo, sin querer que encontremos “al Niño” que puede cambiar nuestras vidas. Los Magos nos enseñan que la vida es un viaje y que estamos invitados a vivirla como lo hizo Jesús, mientras que los Herodes de este mundo nos engañan y halagan haciéndonos creer que el éxito y el poder son necesarios para existir.

Con la Epifanía, se cumple la profecía de Isaías, como se puede discernir en la primera lectura: “¡Levántate y resplandece, Jerusalén! Porque ha llegado tu luz” (Is. 60:1ss). Es como si la liturgia dijera: no se aíslen, no se rindan, no permanezcan prisioneros de sus “convicciones”, no se desmoralicen, reaccionen, “**¡levanten la mirada!**” Como los Magos, observen “**la estrella**” y encontrarán “**la estrella Jesús**”.

The Magi “**raise their eyes**” and set out on a journey, going where it was logical to “seek” a king, in a palace. Their arrival creates a bit of turmoil, so much so that King Herod convokes the priests and pharisees, the experts in Sacred Scripture. They “know” that the Messiah would be born in “Bethlehem”. But their “knowing” does not go beyond. They do not “get up”; they remain safe and comfortable in the palace. The Magi arrive from afar; the priests and pharisees are already near, yet they are blinded by their knowledge, by their certainties, by their privileged positions.... It seems that God reveals Himself to those who do not bask in their own light, to those who do not seek the limelight of notoriety.

The Magi set out following the star, but at a certain point they no longer saw it. So strong had their certainty been that the newborn King would be in the palace – a certainty that had momentarily dazzled their eyes to the point that they lost their way. But then, accepting the fact that they had been mistaken, they “convert” themselves, and the star reappears, guiding them toward their goal. This is a beautiful and important passage because it makes us understand that the human person is never that of falling, of making a mistake, but of giving up after falling. Like the Magi, who were searchers of truth, we sometimes or often risk allowing ourselves to be dazzled by our own convictions to the point of losing our way.

Today, we are taught not to be afraid to question our own certainties and conclusions because a true “creature” knows how to accept their mistakes and continue their journey. Our hearts have great desires, they thirst for justice and truth, for joy and hope. To follow the star is to follow these same lofty, noble, just, beautiful desires that enter the heart and are capable of moving us through life, of setting us on our journey knowing how to face hardships, risks and defeats, just as the Magi did.

When our search is energized by truth, then we find what we are seeking, even if it comes from a “*Child wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in a manger*” (Lk. 2:12). This passage is interesting. It is not enough to “seek” if our hearts are not pure, if they are not free from prejudice, if they are not guided by sentiments of truth. “

Epiphany not only manifests Jesus, the Son of God, but also reveals our hearts. It shows us that the Savior can be welcomed (as happened with the shepherds and the Magi) and rejected (as happened with King Herod). Let’s not hide the fact that there are aspects of “the magi” and aspects of “King Herod” in each of us. There’s a part of us already ready to set out on the journey, to know and understand, to grow and improve, to surpass ourselves. But there is also a Herod always ready to destroy our dreams and hopes. A Herod, always ready to massacre, lurks behind our desire for what is good, beautiful and right, not wanting us to find “the Child” who can change our lives. The Magi teach us that life is a journey and that we are invited to live it as Jesus did, while the Herod’s of this world delude and flatter us into believing that success and power are necessary in order to exist.

With Epiphany, Isaiah’s prophecy is fulfilled, as can be discerned through the first reading: “*Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come*” (Is. 60:1ff). It’s as if the liturgy is saying – don’t cut yourselves off, don’t give up, don’t remain prisoners of your “convictions”, don’t be demoralized, react, “**lift up your eyes**”! Like the Magi, observe “the star” **and you will find “the star Jesus”**.

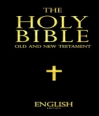
Please Be Mindful of Respectful Dress Code For Divine Worship

Marriage: Please contact the church office to visit with your priest at least six months before setting a date as premarital classes must be attended prior to the wedding.
