Last week, we reflected on the three major causes of temptation, which are the devil, the world, and our own fallen nature. We noted that God is never the cause of temptation, because the goal of the tempter is to turn us against God, bringing division and disorder into God's creation. So, Jesus teaches us to "watch and pray so that you will not enter into temptation. For the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak" (Matt 26:41). Again, Jesus teaches why we must be vigilant at all times and pray, "so that you may have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man" (Luke 21:36). **Though God does not tempt anyone, he permits the tempter** (the devil) to tempt God's people, as we see in the story of Job, the righteous man. The Son of God himself was tempted in every way as we are, yet he was without sin (Hebrews 4:15). There is a certain usefulness to temptations:

1. **Temptation reveals our evil inclinations to us.** In times of temptation, we come to know ourselves. Commenting on this petition, Origen said, "There is a certain usefulness to temptation. No one but God knows what our soul has received from him, not even we ourselves. But temptation reveals it in order to teach us to know ourselves, and in this way, we discover our evil inclinations and are obliged to give thanks for the goods that temptation has revealed to us" (CCC 2847).
 2. **Temptations imply a decision of the heart** (CCC 2848). St. Paul reminds believers that both tests and temptations are normal, but God always provides an escape. He says, "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it" (1 Cor 10:13).
 3. **God accomplishes his will and purpose in our temptations.** He permits certain temptations and allows us to go through tests and trials in order to accomplish his divine will. Just as in the case of Abraham, God asked him to sacrifice his son. When God saw Abraham's obedience and faith, he made him the father of many nations and generations. He is praised today as the "father of faith." Through the temptations and trials of Jesus, God accomplished our salvation and brought us eternal life.
Temptations and trials help us "to train ourselves to be godly" (1 Tim 4:7). They help us to become channels of grace to others. When we overcome our temptations and trials like the Saints did, we too can become a source of strength and an example for others.

Therefore, when we pray this petition, let us ask God for these graces: a discerning heart to recognize God's grace in times of trials and temptations; the strength to fight the good fight and overthrow the tempter, just as Jesus did in the wilderness and at the Garden of Gethsemane; and the ability to become good examples and channels of grace to others who are being tempted in many ways. In our trials and temptations, we must never forget that God always fights for us, not against us.

El Sagrado Corazón de Jesús

La Fiesta del **Sagrado Corazón de Jesús honra el corazón físico de Jesucristo como símbolo de su amor ilimitado y apasionado por toda la humanidad.** La devoción al Sagrado Corazón está profundamente arraigada en la historia y vida espiritual de nuestra Iglesia, reflejando el núcleo de la fe cristiana: el amor y la misericordia infinitos de Dios.

La devoción al Sagrado Corazón ganó una importancia significativa en el siglo XVII, principalmente a través de las revelaciones de Santa Margarita María de Alacoque, una monja francesa de la Visitación. Entre 1673 y 1675, Santa Margarita María reportó una serie de visiones en las que Jesús expresaba su profundo amor por la humanidad y su dolor por la indiferencia y la ingratitud mostradas hacia su amor sacrificial.

En estas visiones, Jesús reveló su corazón como un símbolo de su amor divino, rodeado de espinas que representan los pecados y la ingratitud de la humanidad. Él pidió que se estableciera una fiesta en honor a su Sagrado Corazón, prometiendo bendiciones a quienes practicaran esta devoción. El mensaje se difundió rápidamente, y para 1856, el Papa Pío IX instituyó formalmente la Fiesta del Sagrado Corazón para la Iglesia universal.

Esta devoción llama a los fieles a responder al amor de Jesús abrazando sus enseñanzas, realizando actos de reparación por los pecados y esforzándose por encarnar su amor en su vida diaria. Subraya la relación íntima entre Dios y la humanidad, invitando a los creyentes a confiar en el amor inagotable de Dios y a buscar consuelo y fortaleza en el corazón de Cristo.

La Fiesta del Sagrado Corazón sirve como un poderoso recordatorio del amor perdurable de Dios por toda la humanidad, animando a los fieles a confiar en la misericordia de Jesús y a difundir su amor en un mundo que necesita desesperadamente sanación y unidad. Al celebrar esta fiesta, la Iglesia renueva su compromiso de vivir el amor de Cristo, invitando a todos a experimentar la paz y la alegría que provienen de descansar en el corazón de Jesús.

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Feast of **The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus** honors the physical heart of Jesus Christ as a symbol of his boundless and passionate love for all of humanity. The devotion to the Sacred Heart is deeply rooted in our Church's history and spiritual life, reflecting the core of Christian faith: the infinite love and mercy of God.

The devotion of the Sacred Heart gained significant prominence in the 17th century, primarily through the revelations of Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French Visitation nun. Between 1673 and 1675, Saint Margaret Mary reported a series of visions in which Jesus expressed his deep love for humanity and his sorrow over the indifference and ingratitude shown to his sacrificial love.

In these visions, Jesus revealed his heart as a symbol of his divine love, surrounded by thorns representing the sins and ingratitude of humanity. He requested that a feast be established in honor of his Sacred Heart, promising blessings to those who practiced this devotion. The message spread quickly, and by 1856, Pope Pius IX formally instituted the Feast of the Sacred Heart for the universal Church.

This devotion calls the faithful to respond to Jesus' love by embracing his teachings, engaging in acts of reparation for sins, and striving to embody his love in their daily lives. It underscores the intimate relationship between God and humanity, inviting believers to trust in God's unending love and to seek comfort and strength in the heart of Christ.

The Feast of the Sacred Heart serves as a powerful reminder of God's enduring love for all humanity, encouraging the faithful to trust in Jesus' mercy and to spread his love in a world in desperate need of healing and unity. As the Church celebrates this feast, it renews its commitment to living out the love of Christ, inviting all to experience the peace and joy that comes from resting in the heart of Jesus.

Do you Need Sacraments?
For all your Sacramental needs call the church office, fill out necessary forms, and make an appointment with the priest, take Sacramental preparation classes. DO NOT SET A DATE for a celebration without consulting the priest, and taking necessary classes for the Sacraments.

Baptisms: Please contact the church office at least three months prior to setting a date of Baptism. Pre-Baptismal classes are required for the parents and godparents/sponsors. Submit the child's birth certificate.

Marriage: Please contact the church office to visit with your priest at least six months prior to setting a date of your Wedding. Marriage prep classes are required. Marriage Forms need to be submitted to the parish.

For both of these sacraments you must be a member of our Parish and must complete the classes required. If you belong to another Parish and are seeking the Sacraments in our parish, you must bring a letter from your priest.

Requirements for Godparents / Sponsors: Must be a Catholic in good standing. That means, practicing your faith, married in the Church by priest or deacon. If you come from other parish bring a letter from your priest.

If you need Annulment for your previous marriage, please contact the priest or a deacon.

Matrimonio: Por favor comuníquese con la oficina de la iglesia para reunirse con el sacerdote **al menos seis meses antes** de fijar la fecha de su boda. Se requieren **clases de preparación matrimonial.** Los **formularios de matrimonio** deben entregarse a la parroquia.

Para **ambos sacramentos**, usted debe ser **miembro de nuestra parroquia** y completar las clases requeridas. Si pertenece a otra parroquia y desea recibir los sacramentos en nuestra parroquia, debe traer **una carta de su sacerdote.**

Requisitos para Padrinos / Patrocinadores: Deben ser **católicos en buen estado con la Iglesia.** Esto significa practicar su fe y, si están casados, estar **casados por la Iglesia** por un sacerdote o diácono. Si vienen de otra parroquia, deben traer **una carta de su sacerdote.**

Si necesita **una anulación de su matrimonio anterior**, por favor comuníquese con el sacerdote o con un diácono.

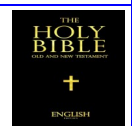
