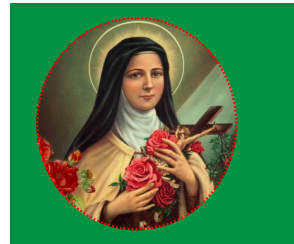

This is a principle of the Kingdom of Heaven that He will fulfill with His own body and blood, soul and divinity. He Who is the Word of God, by the power of the Spirit of God and the “Yes!” of the Blessed Virgin Mary, took on our human flesh to become one like us, a “seed” filled with the promise of abundant life. To fulfill His mission of gaining our salvation, our Lord laid down His life; the seed had to fall to the earth and die, so that it could bear much fruit. What yields to the joy of life everlasting must pass through the vale of suffering and surrender. May God grant us the grace to stand by faith with Paul, who declares that “the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us.” Our hope rests not in our own strength to endure, but in the certainty of God's promise that “My word shall not return to Me void, but shall do My will, achieving the end for which I sent it.” Come, Word of God, come, Lord Jesus, teach us Your Way and Your Truth, and share with us Your Life. ***** «La semilla que cae en buena tierra dará una cosecha abundante», nos enseña Jesús. ¿Cómo decido cuánto contribuir a la iglesia? (Parte 2)

Decidir cuánto dar a tu parroquia católica es, en última instancia, una cuestión de oración, gratitud y administración responsable.

Ora al respecto. Pídele a Dios que guíe tu decisión y te ayude a dar con un corazón generoso y alegre.

Considera tu situación financiera. Tu donativo debe ser significativo y al mismo tiempo permitirte cumplir con tus responsabilidades hacia tu familia, vivienda, alimentación, atención médica y otras obligaciones esenciales.

Da de manera constante. Un donativo regular semanal o mensual a menudo ayuda tanto a tu disciplina espiritual como a la capacidad de tu parroquia para planear su ministerio.

Revisa tus donativos cada año. Si tus ingresos aumentan o tus circunstancias financieras cambian, considera si puedes aumentar tu apoyo. Podrías preguntarte:

- ¿Puedo dar esta cantidad regularmente sin descuidar las necesidades de mi familia?
- ¿Este donativo refleja mi gratitud a Dios por Sus bendiciones?
- ¿Esta cantidad es un sacrificio, en lugar de ser solo algo que *no voy a extrañar*?
- ¿Puedo aumentarla un poco cada año según me sea posible?

Lo más importante no es alcanzar un porcentaje en particular, sino dar libremente, fielmente y con alegría, como nos recuerda San Pablo: *"Cada uno debe dar según lo que haya decidido en su corazón, no de mala gana ni por obligación, porque Dios ama al que da con alegría"* (2 Corintios 9:7).

How do I decide how much to contribute to the church? (Part 2)

Deciding how much to give to your Catholic parish is ultimately a matter of prayer, gratitude, and responsible stewardship. **Pray about it.** Ask God to guide your decision and help you give with a generous and joyful heart.

Consider your financial situation. Your gift should be meaningful while still allowing you to meet your responsibilities to your family, housing, food, healthcare, and other essential obligations.

Give consistently. A regular weekly or monthly gift often helps both your spiritual discipline and your parish's ability to plan its ministry.

Review your giving annually. If your income increases or your financial circumstances change, consider whether you can increase your support. You might ask yourself:

- Can I give this amount regularly without neglecting my family's needs?
- Does this gift reflect my gratitude to God for His blessings?
- Is this amount a sacrifice, rather than only what I won't miss?
- Can I increase it a little each year as I am able?

The most important thing is not reaching a particular percentage but giving freely, faithfully, and cheerfully, as Saint Paul reminds us: *"Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver"* (2 Corinthians 9:7).

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Do you Need Sacraments? For all your Sacramental needs call the church office, fill out necessary forms, make an appointment with the priest, and take Sacramental preparation classes. DO NOT SET A DATE for a celebration without consulting the priest, and taking necessary classes for the Sacraments. Baptisms: Please contact the church office at least <u>three months prior to setting a date of Baptism</u>. Pre– Baptismal classes are required for the parents and godparents/sponsors. Submit the child’s birth certificate. Marriage: Please contact the church office to visit with your priest <u>at least six months prior to setting a date</u> of your Wedding. Marriage prep classes are required. Marriage Forms need to be submitted to the parish. For both of these sacraments you must be a member of our Parish and must complete the classes required. <u>If you belong to another Parish and are seeking the Sacraments in our parish, you must bring a letter from your priest.</u> Requirements for Godparents / Sponsors: Must be a Catholic in good standing. That means, practicing your faith, married in the Church by priest or deacon. If you come from other parish bring a letter from your priest. If you need Annulment for your previous marriage, please contact the priest or a deacon.	¿Necesita Sacramentos? Requisitos para Padrinos / Patrocinadores: Deben ser católicos en buen estado con la Iglesia. Esto significa practicar su fe y, si están casados, estar casados por la Iglesia por un sacerdote o diácono. Si vienen de otra parroquia, deben traer una carta de su sacerdote. Si necesita una anulación de su matrimonio anterior, por favor comuníquese con el sacerdote o con un diácono.
