November 16, 2025, Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time: Grades of Prayer - 6. Prayer of Quiet - Definition and Characteristics

The Prayer of Quiet has ancient roots in early Christianity, particularly in the tradition of the Desert Fathers and Mothers. These early monks withdrew into the desert not to escape reality, but to free themselves from the social and political pressures of the Roman Empire. Their aim was to discover the inner silence needed to calm the restless mind. Originally called the "prayer of quiet," this way of seeking God came to be known as contemplation. The desert monks recognized that only through inner freedom, true love, wisdom, and the grace of God could the world be transformed and the Kingdom of God-marked by justice, peace, and love-be established. Immersed too deeply in worldly thinking and behavior. Christianity risks losing its power to act as "light and salt" in the world. For this reason, the prayerful witness of the Desert Fathers and Mothers, and of holy men and women throughout history, emphasizes the essential role of prayer. Each Christian is likewise called to cultivate inner freedom, peace, courage, and joy in order to help build a kingdom of love and peace amid hatred and unrest, and a kingdom of justice amid oppression and inequality. For the desert mystics, solitude was not an escape into comfort or inactivity. Henri Nouwen describes solitude as "a place of conversion, the place where the old self dies and the new self is born, the place where the emergence of the person occurs." Solitude is a bold encounter with our most authentic self in the presence of God's pure love. Such contemplation naturally flows into action, allowing one to return to the world renewed and more capable of serving others.

St. Teresa of Avila teaches that the Prayer of Quiet is a form of contemplative, silent prayer in which one enters inner stillness to encounter God. It is marked by a focused mind and a deep peace that enables the soul to "listen" to God's presence. This prayer is considered a supernatural gift, bestowed by divine grace rather than achieved by human effort. Still, ordinary forms of prayer-including meditation, reflection, and sustained silence—can prepare the soul to receive this gift. Several key characteristics mark the Prayer of Quiet. 1. it involves inner silence, the calming of the obsessive mind. 2. it is a divine gift that cannot be produced by willpower alone. 3. it is entirely God-centered. 4. it brings profound peace and rest to the soul. Finally, in this state the will is captivated by God, while other faculties—such as the intellect, imagination, memory, and emotions remain active, though less dominant. In the Fourth Mansions of the Interior Castle, St. Teresa lists the spiritual effects of this prayer: a spirit of deep freedom; filial fear of God and carefulness not to offend Him; strong confidence in God; love of sacrifice; deep humility; disdain for worldly pleasures; and growth in virtue. Therefore, one should not be discouraged if this mystical state has not vet been reached. Fidelity to daily prayer, silence, solitude, meditation, and the practice of virtues such as love, humility, and patience will gradually dispose the soul to receive the higher gifts of the Holy Spirit.


