#### November 23, 2025, Thirty Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Grades of Prayer – 7. Prayer of Union – Definition and Characteristics

St. Teresa of Avila elaborates extensively on the topic of prayer, identifying and clearly distinguishing several grades. According to her, there are nine grades of prayer: Vocal prayer, Meditation, Affective prayer, Prayer of simplicity (the first step toward contemplative or mystical prayer), Contemplative prayer—which includes three stages: natural, infused, and mystical, Prayer of quiet, Prayer of union, Prayer of confirming union or spiritual betrothal, Prayer of transforming union or spiritual marriage between God and the soul, regarded as the highest form of prayer. The last four grades are considered mystical forms of prayer. In the prayer of quiet, the will of the person is wholly occupied by God. Turning now to the prayer of union, St. Teresa defines it as a mystical state in which all the interior faculties-memory, imagination, intuition, intellect, and will-are captivated by God. In contrast, during the prayer of quiet only the will is captivated, while the other faculties remain free. In both the confirming union and transforming union, however, the whole person—along with all faculties and even the bodily senses—is fully occupied by God.

In the prayer of union, the soul experiences divine reality with such intensity that it may easily fall into ecstasy. At first, this sublime absorption in God lasts only a short time (usually no more than half an hour), but as the intensity deepens, it can be prolonged for several hours. St. Teresa identifies four signs or characteristics of the prayer of union: 1. Absence of distractions - Memory and imagination, which ordinarily cause distractions, are now possessed by God, making distraction psychologically impossible. 2. Certainty of intimate union - The soul is sure of its union with God. If it experiences fear or doubt about this union, then it is not truly in the state of prayer. 3. Absence of weariness - The soul absorbed in God never tires of its union with the Beloved. It is overwhelmed with delight and, however long the prayer lasts, experiences no fatigue. For this reason, St. Teresa says this form of prayer can never harm the individual, no matter how long it endures. 4. A transformed disposition - The soul that experiences such intimacy longs to suffer trials, willingly undertakes penance for sin, loses delight in earthly pleasures, and grieves when God is offended. It finds no rest in created things and desires that all people come to know the sweetness of God. St. John of the Cross describes four accompanying phenomena or graces that may occur during the prayer of union: Mystical touches - Instantaneous supernatural impressions that give the soul a sense of having been touched by God. Flights of the spirit - Strong, unexpected impulses of divine love that leave the soul with a consuming thirst for God. Fiery darts of love - Hidden touches that, like fiery arrows, burn and pierce the soul, leaving it entirely cauterized by divine love. These are not physical wounds, though they are felt as such. The wounds of love - Inner impressions caused by the profound knowledge of God. Both St. John of the Cross and St. Teresa warn that such intense experiences cannot be produced by personal effort or force. The higher forms of prayer are purely God's gift, granted to the soul that remains faithful to the lower grades of prayer, living a life of charity, with a humble and pure heart. — Fr. Jesu

**Matrimonio:** el padre debe ser contactado durante al menos seis meses antes de la boda. Recuerda tomar clases antes de fijar la fecha.

Para ambos sacramentos debe ser miembro de nuestra parroquia y estar en buena posición. Si perteneces a otra parroquia y deseas recibir los Sacramentos en nuestra parroquia, debes traer una carta de tu párroco.

Quinceañera: Si está planeando un quinceañera, asegúrese de comunicarse primero con la oficina de la iglsia, antes de fijar una fecha.
