I am a Consultant Clinical Neuropsychologist and Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) registered Clinical Psychologist, with over 16 years' experience of working with individuals with neurorehabilitation needs and other complex health difficulties. I have worked in both the NHS and the private sector, working in a wide range of settings including acute hospitals, post-acute rehabilitation units, community settings and residential homes. I have completed post-doctoral Clinical Neuropsychology training at the University of Nottingham, and I am a member of the Specialist Register on Clinical Neuropsychology (SRCN) which is the gold standard for the profession in the UK. I have experience of supervising both clinical placements and field supervising doctoral thesis projects for the University of Hull's Clinical Psychology Training course, and I contribute to teaching on this course on an ongoing basis.

I have extensive experience of working with individuals with both acquired and degenerative neurological conditions, working with adults across the lifespan. My clinical work includes neuropsychological assessment, assessment of psychological difficulties, risk assessment, neurorehabilitation and therapeutic work, with individuals and their families. I am experienced at working with individuals who are being supported under the Mental Capacity Act and Mental Health Act. I am also experienced in working with individuals with life limiting conditions and significant life changing injuries, including amputations, spinal injuries, complex fractures, and individuals undergoing limb reconstruction.

I regularly provide teaching, consultation, and supervision to qualified health professionals from a range of professional backgrounds and to support workers and carers. I firmly believe in the importance of joint working with multidisciplinary colleagues, to achieve the optimal outcomes for individuals under my care. I strive to work collaboratively with individuals referred to me and with their families to ensure high-quality, person-centered care.
