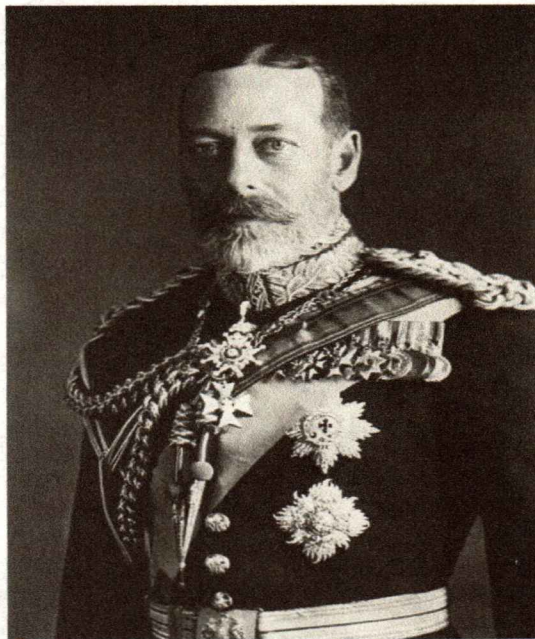

King George VI, from 11 December 1936 – 6 February 1952. He was a Knight of the Garter.

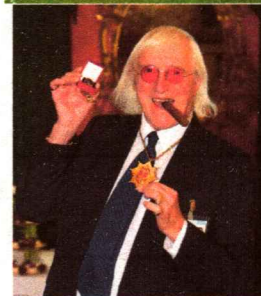
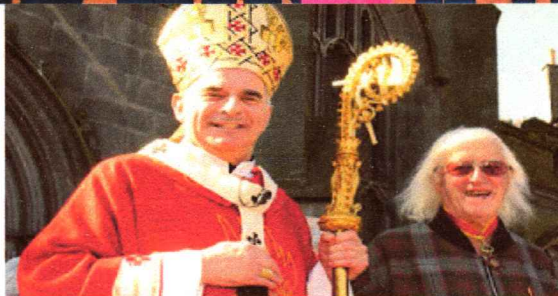

Equestrian Order of St. Gregory the Great



The Order of St. Gregory the Great was established in 1831 by Pope Gregory XVI. This special Knighthood is bestowed upon Roman Catholic men and women (and in rare cases to non-Catholics) in recognition of their personal service to the Holy See and to the Roman Catholic Church, through their unusual labors and their support of the Vatican. The sovereign head of the Order resides in the Pope - currently Pope Francis.

Sacred Military Constantinian Order of Saint George



The Sacred Military Constantinian Order of Saint George is a Roman Catholic order said to be established by Constantine the Great. The order was officially founded sometime between 1520 and 1545 by two brothers belonging to the Angeli Comneni family. Members of the Angeli Comneni family remained grand masters throughout the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. In 1699, Francesco Farnese, Duke of Parma was recognized as grand master. In 1731, his son and successor, Antonio Farnese, Duke of Parma, died without male heirs. He was succeeded by the first Bourbon grand master, Charles, Duke of Parma (later King Charles III of Spain). Since that time, members of the House of Bourbon have been grand masters of the order. The current heads of the Constantinian Order are: Prince Carlo of Bourbon-Two Sicilies, Duke of Castro and Infante Carlos of Spain, Prince of the Two Sicilies, Duke of Calabria. The Order works closely with the Order of Malta, Order of the Garter, and the Jesuit Order.

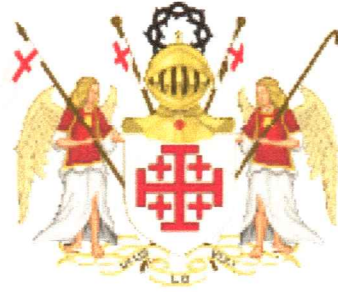

Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem



The earliest of the four major military knighthood orders formed in the Holy Land between the late 11th century and the early 12th century was the Knights of the Holy Sepulchre in the year 1099 - the same year as the Knights Hospitaller (Malta). They were meant to work in conjunction along with the later formed Knights Templar in 1118.

In 1489, Pope Innocent VIII suppressed the Order and ruled that it was to be merged with the Knights Hospitaller. In 1496, Pope Alexander VI restored the Order of Holy Sepulchre to independent status. Alexander VI decreed that the senior post of the Order would be raised to the rank of Grand Master.

Pius IX re-established the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem in 1847 and re-organized the Order. Pius X ordained that the Order's cape or mantle, as worn by the original knights, be a "white cloak with the cross of Jerusalem in red enamel." Pius X assumed the title of Grand Master. The title of Grand Master is now held by a cardinal of the Roman Curia who is resident in Rome at the Palazzo della Rovere, the 15th century palace of Pope Julius II, immediately adjacent to the Vatican and the Headquarters of the Jesuit Order. The Order of the Holy Sepulchre works alongside the Order of Malta and is guided by the Jesuit Order.







Grand Masters of the Order

In 1496, Pope Alexander VI created the office of Grand Master of the Order, and the office was vested in the papacy. The office of Grand Master remained vested in the papacy until 1949. Since that time, the following cardinals have held the office:

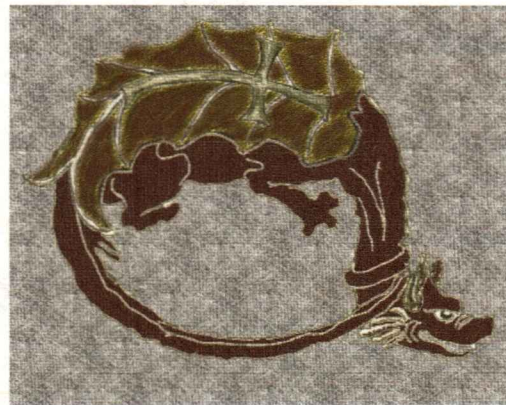

Order of the Dragon

The **Order of the Dragon** (Latin: *Societas Draconistrarum*, lit. "Society of the Dragonists") was a monarchical chivalric order for selected nobility, founded in 1408 by Sigismund, who was King of Hungary (1387-1437) and later Holy Roman Emperor (1433-1437). The order was fashioned after the military orders of the Crusades such as the Templar Knights. It flourished during the first half of the 15th century, primarily in Germany and Italy. The royal families who were associated with this Order eventually merged into the Order of the Garter and Order of the Golden Fleece.

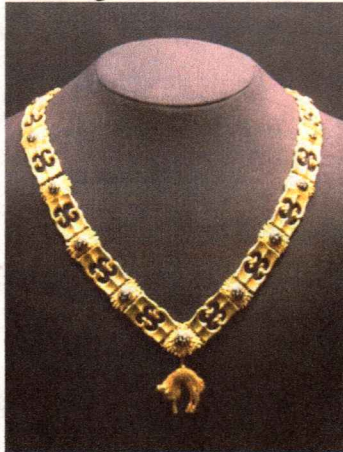

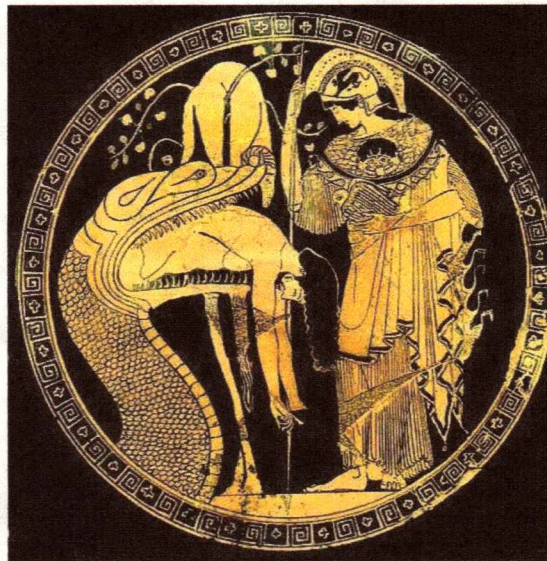
Order of the Golden Fleece

The **Order of the Golden Fleece** (Portuguese: Ordem do Tosão de Ouro; French: Ordre de la Toison d'Or; German: Orden vom Goldenen Vlies; Italian: Ordine del Toson d'Oro; Spanish: Orden del Toisón de Oro) is an order of chivalry founded in Bruges by Philip III, Duke of Burgundy in 1430, to celebrate his marriage to the Portuguese princess Infanta Isabella of Portugal, daughter of King John I of Portugal, uniting certain royal family bloodlines. It evolved and became one of the top two most prestigious orders in Europe (other being Order of Garter). Today there exist two branches of the Order: the Spanish and the Austrian Fleece; the current sovereigns are respectively Juan Carlos I, King of Spain, and Karl von Habsburg, grandson of Emperor Charles I of Austria. Many of the Knights within this Order are also Knights of the Order of Malta, and Knights of the Garter. Several members are Knights of all three Orders.

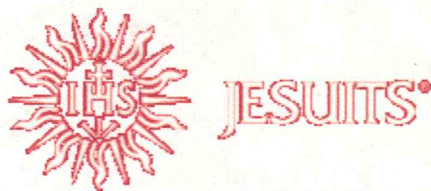

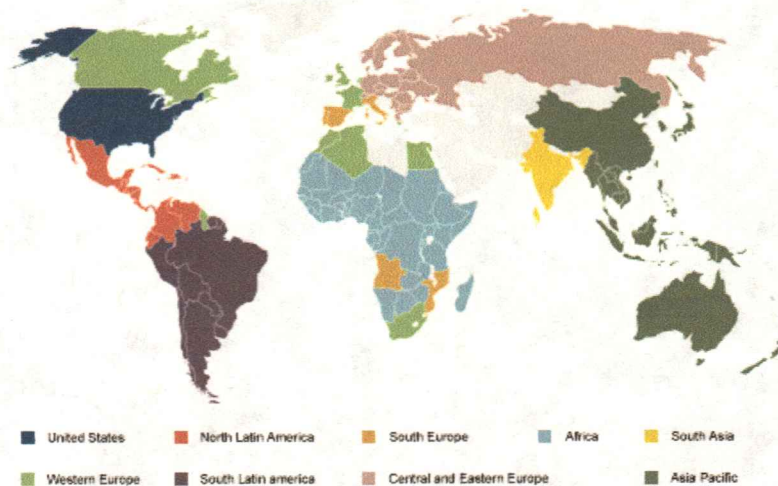

By looking closely at this topical map of continents with labeled countries, there are very interesting observations to be made when compared to the worldwide Jesuit Assistency map on the previous page as well as below. As openly admitted and recognized, each colored section on the Jesuit map represents grouped areas which offices are located and members of the Jesuit Order are conducting relations with both government and its citizens of such area. The grey, non-colored sections are very scarce, and show the remaining areas of the world which are free from Jesuit international relations. These countries include Afghanistan, Iraq, Libya, Syria, and Iran among others. In the last 10 years, the majority of the countries mentioned have been invaded, bombed, and internationally sanctioned. This is far from coincidence.

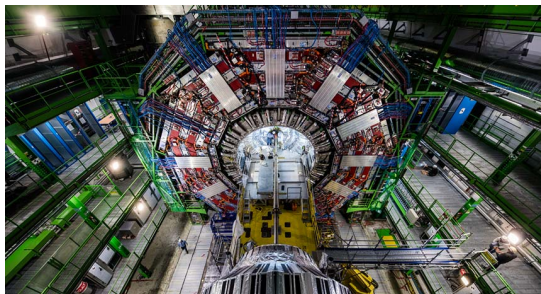
Switzerland is a country situated in western, central and southern Europe. The sovereign state is a federal republic bordered by Italy to the south, France to the west, Germany to the north, and Austria and Liechtenstein to the east. The Black Nobility / Royal families in Europe whom comprise the modern day “Illuminati” created Switzerland to function as a giant international world bank and centralized power for world government and organizations. Recruits to the guards must be unmarried Swiss Catholic males between 19 and 30 years of age who have completed basic training with the Swiss Armed Forces. The Vatican and Switzerland have been closely tied together militarily and financially since the beginning.

BANK FOR INTERNATIONAL SETTLEMENTS



The Bank for International Settlements (BIS) is an international financial institution owned by central banks which "fosters international monetary and financial cooperation and serves as a bank for central banks". The BIS carries out its work through its meetings, programs and through the Basel Process – hosting international groups pursuing global financial stability and facilitating their interaction. It also provides banking services, but only to central banks and other international organizations. It is based in Basel, Switzerland.

The BIS was established in 1930 by an intergovernmental agreement between Germany, Belgium, France, the United Kingdom, Italy, Japan, the United States, and Switzerland. To the public, the BIS was originally intended to facilitate reparations imposed on Germany by the Treaty of Versailles after World War I. At the outbreak of World War II in September 1939, the BIS Board of Directors – on which the main European central banks were represented – publicly disclosed the decision that the Bank should remain open, but that, for the duration of hostilities, no meetings of the Board of Directors were to take place and that the Bank should maintain a neutral stance in the conduct of its business. However, as the war dragged on evidence mounted that the BIS conducted operations that were helpful to the Germans. Also, throughout the war, the Allies accused the Nazis of looting and pled with the BIS not to accept gold from the Reichsbank in payment for prewar obligations. Operations conducted by the BIS were viewed with increasing suspicion from London and Washington. The fact that top level German industrialists and advisors sat on the BIS board provided ample evidence to historians of how the BIS was used by the Nazi regime throughout the war, with the help of American, British and French banks. Between 1933 and 1945 the BIS board of directors included Walther Funk, a prominent Nazi official, and Emil Puhl (director and vice-president of Germany's Reichsbank), as well as Hermann Schmitz, the director of IG Farben, and Baron von Schroeder, the owner of the J.H. Stein Bank of Cologne.

The truth is that the BIS was being used to fund both sides of the war, while simultaneously being positioned as the equivalent of the bank of the world, fully controlling world finances. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) was later created in July 1944 at the Bretton Woods Conference. The IMF was invented to be an expansion and arm of the Bank for International Settlements (BIS). In 2003 the BIS changed its unit of account from the gold franc to the Special Drawing Right (SDR), which is the unit of account for many international organizations, including the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

Taken from the Bank for International Settlements website: “Basel III: international regulatory framework for banks - Basel III is an internationally agreed set of measures developed by the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision in response to the financial crisis of 2007-09. The measures aim to strengthen the regulation, supervision and risk management of banks. Like all Basel Committee standards, Basel III standards are minimum requirements which apply to internationally active banks. Members are committed to implementing and applying standards in their jurisdictions within the time frame established by the Committee.”

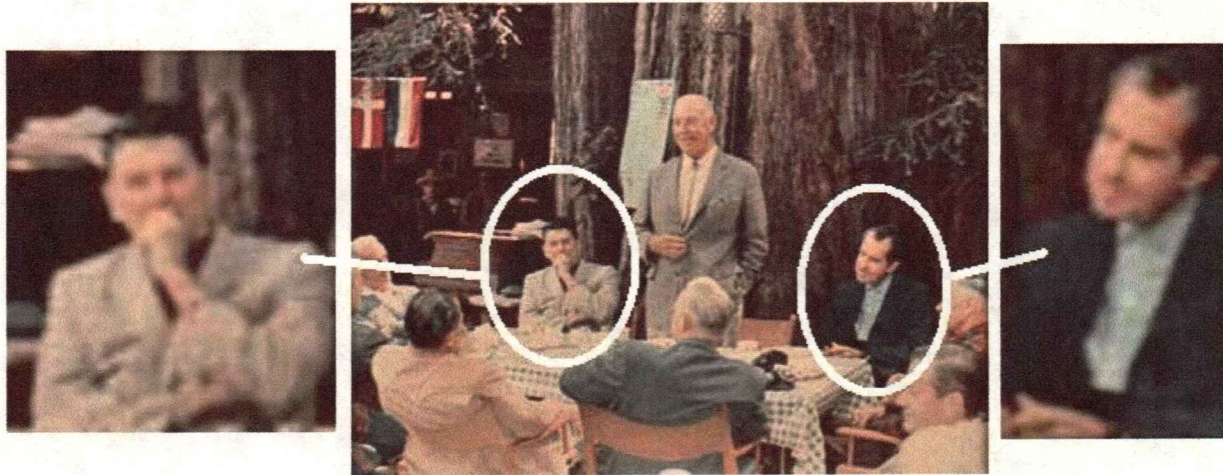
Bohemian Grove

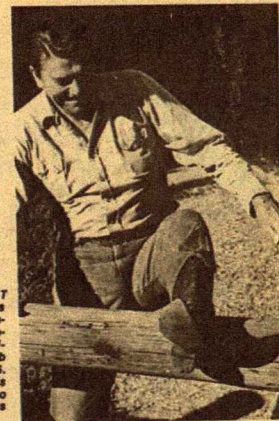
Convicted San Francisco madam Brandy Baldwin has revealed how she supplied prostitutes and entertainment for members of the exclusive Bohemian Grove.

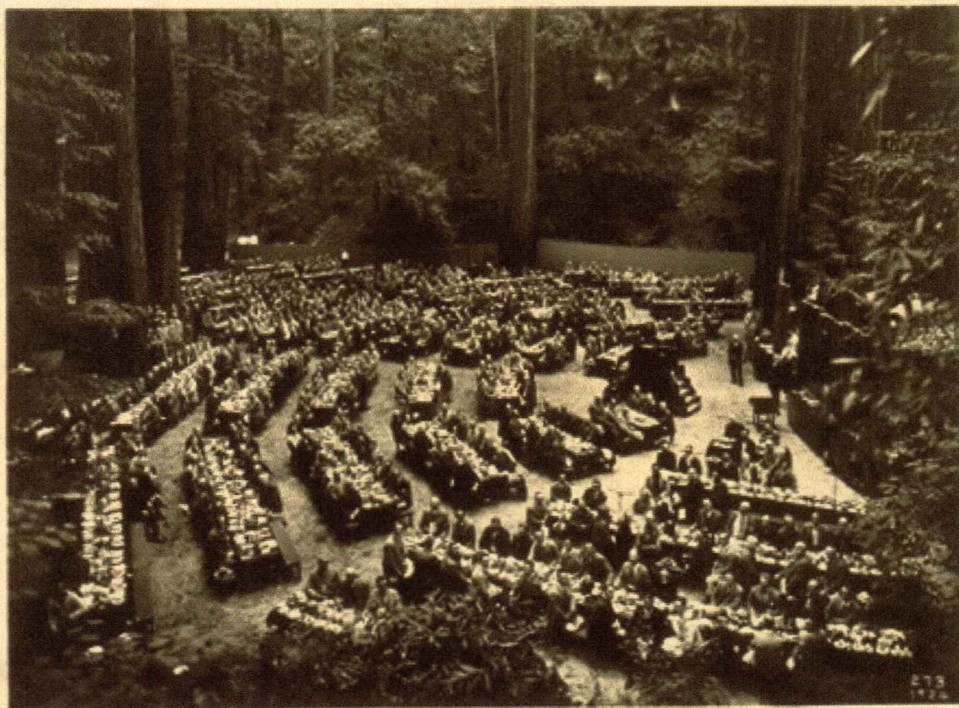

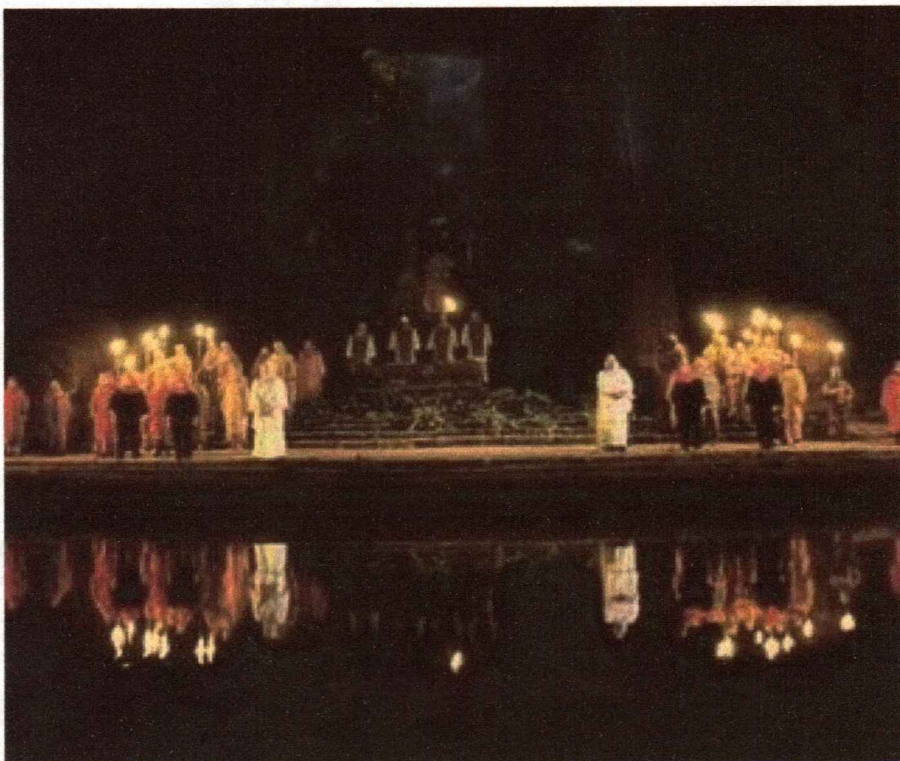

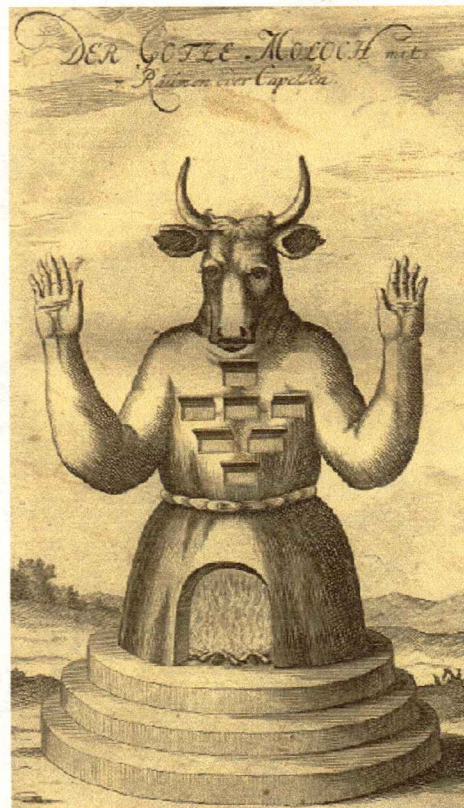


Moloch (Semitic root meaning "king") is the name of an ancient Ammonite god. Moloch worship was practiced by the Canaanites, Phoenician and related cultures in North Africa and the Levant.

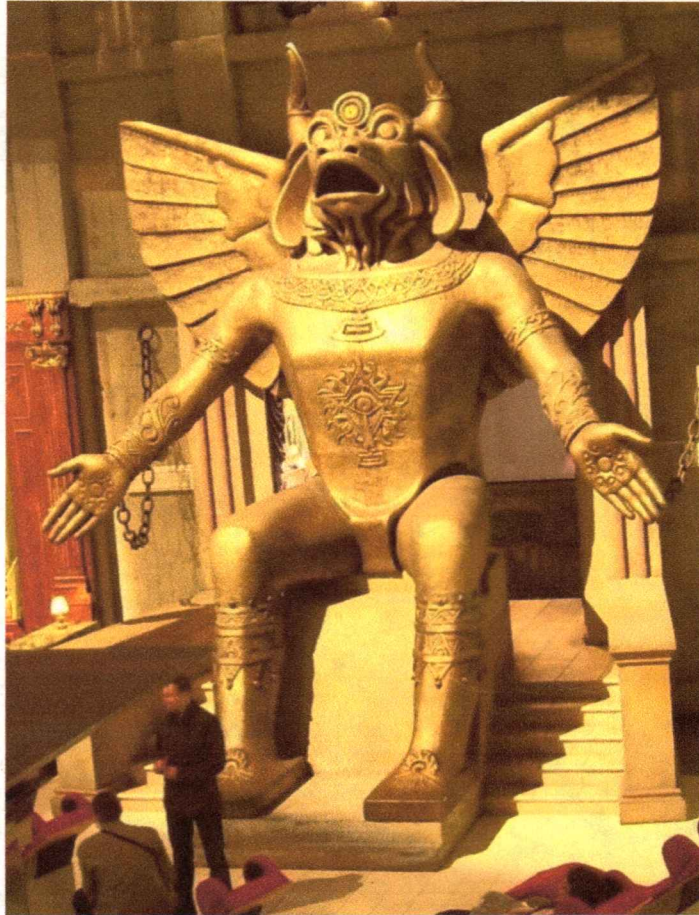
As a god worshipped by the Phoenicians and Canaanites, Moloch had associations with a particular kind of propitiatory child sacrifice by parents. Moloch figures in the Book of Deuteronomy and in the Book of Leviticus as a form of idolatry (Leviticus 18:21: "And thou shalt not let any of thy seed pass through the fire to Moloch"). In the Old Testament, Gehenna was a valley by Jerusalem, where apostate Israelites and followers of various Baalim and Canaanite gods, including Moloch, sacrificed their children by fire (2 Chr. 28:3, 33:6; Jer. 7:31, 19:2–6). In later years Moloch was still worshipped in pagan religions as an owl deity of sacrifice.



William Blake (1809, *The Flight of Moloch*, Watercolour - one of Blake's illustrations of *On the Morning of Christ's Nativity*)

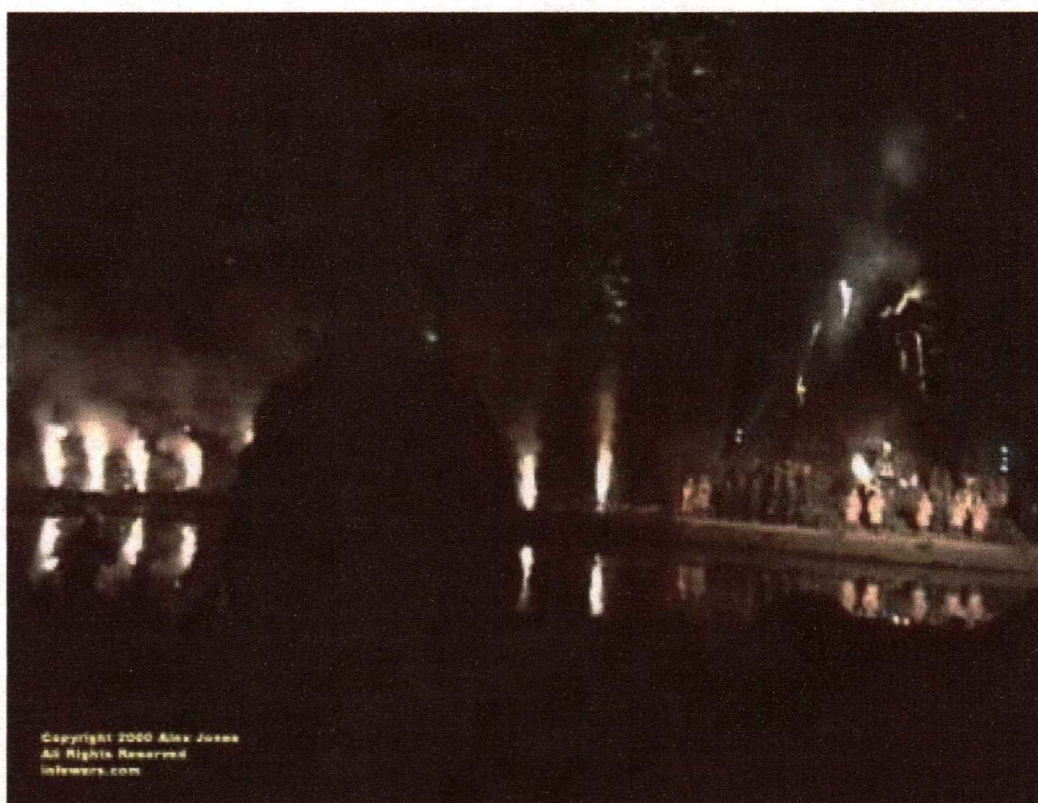
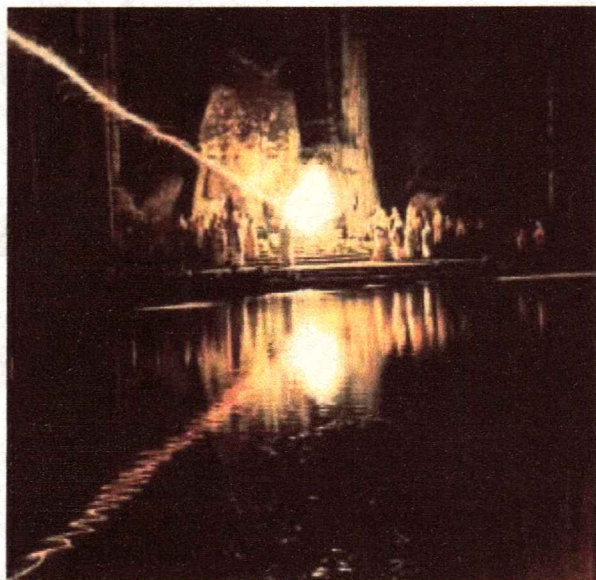


An 18th-century German illustration of Moloch ("*Der Götze Moloch*" i.e. *The Idol Moloch*)

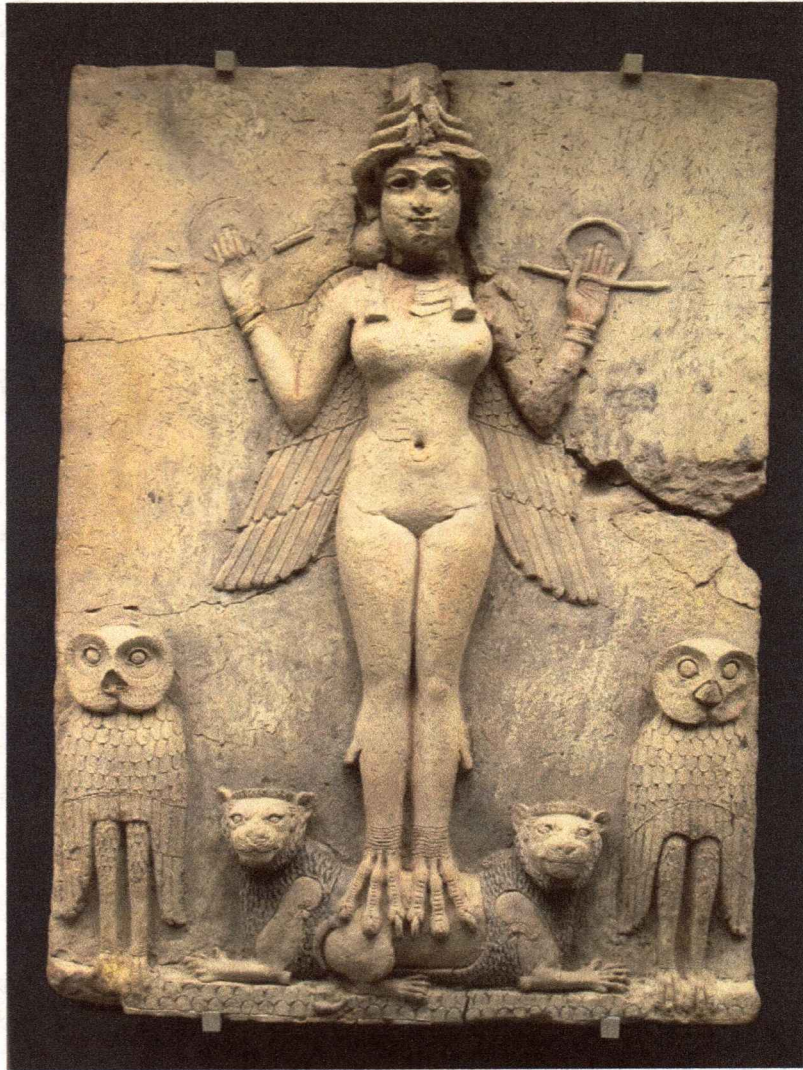


Statue depiction of ancient god Moloch at The Cinema Museum - Turin, Italy
