



## ATTENDEES/FAMILY GUIDELINES/PRECAUTIONS

Trunk or treating may look different this year, but the good news is it CAN work. Event precautions will be in force. Do not attend if you have had COVID-19 symptoms or have been in close contact with someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

It is mandatory that everyone mask up at this event to ward of COVID-19. All trick-or-treaters over age 2 and their accompanying adults should wear a mask. Gloves on costumes may also provide an extra layer of protection.

To avoid reaching into the same bowl, businesses will have prepackaged candy, snacks, or treat bags available on a table laid out in front of their trunk for kids to pick up.

Before you begin, there will be a check-in station. You will be given a squirt of hand sanitizer. All foot traffic will be in one direction. You will be instructed to follow the arrows and X's on the ground as you trunk or treat to keep social distancing.

As an added precaution, have your kids wait until they get home to enjoy their treats. How you approach Halloween candy is up to you and your level of comfort. Have them wash their hands thoroughly with soap and water and maybe even wipe down wrappers before diving in.
