The Tax Collector for the City of Rockingham requests approval of the Council to advertise Tax Liens for the 2021 tax year in accordance with NC G.S. 105-369.

Staff Report to Planning and Zoning Board Agenda Item: IV.A

Issue:

Request for Right-of-way Abandonment: Ed Ladd has requested the abandonment of the 15-foot wide unnamed and unimproved alley extending through the property located at 235 S. Hancock Street (Dave's Welders Supplies).

Background:

On January 20, 2022, Ed Ladd, with Dave's Welders Supplies, submitted a written request for the City Council to abandon the unnamed and unimproved alley that extends through the property located at 235 S. Hancock Street. The alley exists only on paper – it was never actually constructed and utilized by any adjoining property owners. Dave's Welders Supplies owns the property on both sides of the alley.

Staff Comments:

- 1. A map illustrating the location of the unnamed and unimproved alley proposed for abandonment is included in the agenda packet.
- 2. The requested abandonment includes the portion of the alley located adjacent to the property owned by Dave's Welders Supplies only. The 15-wide alley extends between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue between W & W Auto Sales and Serrano's Tires. City staff recommends the entire length of the alley be abandoned between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue.
- 3. As indicated by the aerial map included in the agenda packet, the adjoining property owners are already utilizing the alley right-of-way for their individual business uses. In the opinion of City staff, the abandonment will not adversely affect them in anyway.
- 4. Pursuant to NCGS 160A-299, the alley would be divided equally between all adjoining property owners if abandoned by the City Council.

Staff Recommendation:

City staff recommends the Board review the request and recommend the City Council abandon the entire length of the alley between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue as proposed by City staff.

Planning Board Recommendation:

The Planning Board reviewed the request and recommended the City Council abandon the entire length of the alley between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue as recommended by City staff.




Alley Right-of-way Abandonment

RESOLUTION OF INTENT

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE ROCKINGHAM CITY COUNCIL TO CONSIDER THE ABANDONMENT OF THE UNIMPROVED 15-FOOT WIDE ALLEY EXTENDING BETWEEN LEAK STREET AND E. BROAD AVENUE

WHEREAS, the City Council of Rockingham has received a written request from an adjacent property owner to abandon the unimproved 15-foot wide alley right-of-way extending between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Board reviewed the request and recommended unanimously to the City Council the abandonment of the unimproved alley right-of-way extending between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statue 160A-299 authorizes the City Council to close public streets and alleys; and

WHEREAS, the Rockingham City Council considers it is advisable to conduct a public hearing for the purpose of giving consideration to abandon the unimproved alley right-of-way described as approximately 15 feet in width extending approximately 285 feet in length between Leak Street and E. Broad Avenue.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Rockingham City Council that:

- 1. A public hearing will be held at 6:30 p.m. on the 8th day of March, 2022, in the City Hall Council Chambers to consider a resolution abandoning the right-of-way described above;
- 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Resolution of Intent once a week for four consecutive weeks in the Richmond County Daily Journal;
- 3. The City Clerk is further directed to transmit by registered or certified mail to each owner of property abutting upon that portion of said street a copy of this Resolution of Intent; and
- 4. The City Clerk is further directed to cause adequate notices of this Resolution of Intent and the scheduled public hearing to be posted as required by G.S. 160A-299.
