Re: Demolition Ordinance for Dilapidated Dwelling located at **615 Rockingham Road**

---

City staff recommends the City Council approve a demolition ordinance for the dilapidated dwelling located at 615 Rockingham Road and identified as Richmond County PIN 7473-13-02-4924. A copy of the demolition ordinance and photographs of the property are included in the agenda packet.

As background information, City staff initiated minimum housing proceedings in November of 2023. The property owner, Heirs to the Mattie C. Thomas Estate and parties of interest were notified of a hearing with the Code Enforcement Officer regarding the condition of the dwelling. The notice was sent via certified and regular mail; published in the Richmond County Daily Journal; and posted on the subject property. No one attended the hearing with the Code Enforcement Officer. The Code Enforcement Officer issued his findings of fact and directed the property owners to either repair or demolish the dwelling by February 27, 2024. Again, the notice was sent via certified and regular mail; published in the Richmond County Daily Journal; and posted on the subject property. The property owners have taken no action to date to address the dilapidated dwelling.

City staff did have conversations with several heirs to the estate during which they expressed their interest in selling the property. Those heirs did engage with local attorney Ray Herndon to assist them in conveying the property; therefore, City staff delayed seeking approval of a demolition ordinance for approximately 6 months. Mr. Herndon has recently indicated all heirs are not agreeable to selling the property and he is no longer involved.

**AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE BUILDING INSPECTOR TO REMOVE OR DEMOLISH THE PROPERTY HEREIN DESCRIBED AS UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION AND DIRECTING THAT A NOTICE BE PLACED THEREON THAT THE SAME MAY NOT BE OCCUPIED.**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Rockingham finds that the dwelling described herein is unfit for human habitation under the City Housing Code, and that all the procedures of the Housing Code have been complied with; and

**WHEREAS**, this dwelling should be removed or demolished, as directed by the Building Inspector, and should be placarded by placing thereon a notice prohibiting use for human habitation; and

**WHEREAS**, the owners of this dwelling, the heirs to the Mattie C. Thomas Estate have been given a reasonable opportunity to bring the dwelling up to the standards of the Housing Code in accordance with G.S. 160D-1203 pursuant to an order issued by the Building Inspector on November 29, 2023 and the owner has failed to comply with the order;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Rockingham, that:

- Section 1. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to place a placard containing the legend "*This building is unfit for human habitation; the use or occupation of this building for human habitation is prohibited and unlawful.*" on the building located at 615 Rockingham Road and identified by Richmond County PIN# 7473-13-02-4924.
- Section 2. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to proceed to remove or demolish the above-described dwelling in accordance with his order to the owner thereof dated November 29, 2023 and in accordance with the Housing Code and G.S. 160D-1203.
- Section 3. (a) The cost of removal or demolition shall constitute a lien against the real property upon which the cost was incurred. The lien shall be filed in the office of the City Tax Collector and City Clerk, and shall have the same priority and be collected in the same manner as the lien for special assessments in Article 10 of G.S. Chapter 160A.
  - (b) Upon completion of the required removal or demolition, the Building Inspector shall sell the materials of the dwelling and credit the proceeds against the cost of removal or demolition. The Building Inspector shall certify the remaining balance to the Tax Collector. If a surplus remains after sale of the materials and satisfaction of the cost of removal or demolition, the Building Inspector shall deposit the surplus in the Superior Court where it shall be secured and disbursed in the manner provided by G.S 160D-1203.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or cause to be removed the placard from any building to which it is affixed. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any building therein declared to be unfit for human habitation.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

**GRANT PROJECT ORDINANCE ADOPTING A SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO TRACK FUNDS RECEIVED FROM THE NORTH CAROLINA OFFICE OF STATE BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT – SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CITY OF ROCKINGHAM.**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Rockingham, North Carolina that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following grant project ordinance is hereby adopted:

**SECTION 1:** This ordinance is to establish a budget for a project funded by funds received from the North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management – Special Appropriations to be used for a public purpose. The City of Rockingham is allocated \$200,000;

**SECTION 2:** The Finance Officer and City Manager are hereby directed to approve all expenditures of the grant to ensure funds are spent in accordance with the Scope of Work provided to the North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management and are not spent on prohibited purposes;

**SECTION 3:** The following amounts are appropriated for the project and authorized for expenditure:

**SECTION 7:** This grant project ordinance expires on June 30, 2025, or when all the State Appropriation has been obligated and expended by the City, whichever occurs sooner.

**AUCTION MARKETING AGREEMENT**

THIS CONTRACT made this 29th day of JULY 2024, by and between CITY OF ROCKINGHAM, hereinafter called "Seller" and IRON HORSE AUCTION CO., INC., Professional Auctioneers and Real Estate Brokers of Rockingham, North Carolina, hereinafter called "Auctioneers":

WITNESSETH

That for and in consideration of Fifteen Percent (15%) Commission of the last and final high bid price on items selling for \$1.00 to \$5,000.00, Ten Percent (10%) on items selling for \$5,001.00 to \$10,000.00, Five Percent (5%) Commission for items selling for \$10,001.00 or higher and the Buyer's Premiums described below, the "Parties" hereby covenant and agree as follows:


1. That the Auctioneer shall supply a sufficient amount of Auctioneers, bid assistants, clerks, cashiers, as well as any other persons deemed necessary to properly perform an online auction on the following personal property:

PERSONAL PROPERTY: See attached "Exhibit A".

Selling regardless of price.

2. That the auction is to be held online only using an Internet Service Provider chosen by the Auctioneers beginning on the 2nd day of October 2024 at 8:00 am and ending on the 9th day of October 2024 at 2:00 pm, with extended bidding. Iron Horse Auction Company, Inc. Online Auctions are timed events and all bidding will begin to close at a specified time. Iron Horse Auction Company, Inc. online auctions also have an auto-extend feature. Any bid placed in the final five minutes for an auction item will automatically add 5 minutes to the time the bid was placed. Example: If an auction item is scheduled to close at 3:00 and receives a bid at 2:56, the close time will automatically extend to 3:05. The auto-extend feature will continue until there is a five-minute period without a bid being placed on each item in the auction. We will close 10 auction lots per 5 minutes.
3. That all advertising, promotion and advertising layout will be conducted by AUCTION PROMOTIONS UNLIMITED; the in-house advertising agency of IRON HORSE AUCTION CO., INC. The advertising budget should not exceed \$4,000.00, which is an expense of the Seller, which is payable from the auction proceeds or by Invoice; however, any amount over and above the stated \$4,000.00 shall be at the expense of the Auctioneers. Advertising layout and creation fee included in the advertising budget. A certified accounting of all ads placed shall be provided to the Seller at the closing.
4. That the Seller is to prepare the property and have it in saleable condition on the day of the sale.
5. That the Auctioneer shall be responsible only for the payment of the services of other Auctioneers, bid assistants, clerks, cashiers, and other persons hired by the Auctioneer to perform said auction.

6. That the Auctioneer hereby agrees to use his professional skill, knowledge, and experience to the best advantage of both parties in preparing for and in the conduction of the auction. That the Auctioneer's fee for conducting said auction has been earned upon compliance with the bid on the subject property that has been sold to the last and highest bidder.
7. That no item shall be sold or withdrawn from the sale prior to the auction except by mutual agreement between the Seller and the Auctioneers.
8. That it is agreed the property shall be sold to the highest bidder either individually, in any combination, or as a whole, at the discretion of the Auctioneer. That all bids will be final and no raise of bid period will be allowed.
9. That the Seller covenants that he has good title and the right to sell. Seller further acknowledges that the property shall be sold free and clear of all liens and encumbrances.
10. That the property is sold "as is, where is" with all faults. Any lien or encumbrance shall be paid before at the time of closing or shall attach to the proceeds of the sale. Seller agrees to hold harmless the Auctioneers against any claims of any nature. The Auctioneer shall be the Agent of the Seller only and at no time during the transaction shall represent anyone other than the Seller.
11. That in the event the Seller has any property purchased individually or by a third party on behalf of the Seller; the full Commission and Buyer's Premium shall be due and payable as with any other sale.
12. That the Seller shall be responsible for the Seller's cost of the sales, which are commission and advertising.
13. That the Auctioneers' commission and right to reimbursement for costs advanced are a lien on the property herein involved and may be enforced as though it were a statutory lien.
14. That should there be lien holders, whether individuals or institutions that the Auctioneer has the permission of the Seller to communicate with said lien holders. This communication is in purpose intended for the best and common interest of all parties concerned.
15. That the Seller agrees that the Auction method is unsure and that while many parcels may sell for higher prices than expected, others may sell for a lesser price.
16. That the Auctioneers shall have the right to charge a Buyer's Premium of Six Percent (6%) on all purchases, which shall be the property of the Auctioneers.



The following are activities currently involving our department.

Dental awareness – The N.C. Department of Health and Human Services offered a dental sealant and awareness program to our Day Camp and Swim Camp students. Johnnie Brigman, a public health dental hygienist, spearheaded this project that provided this valuable service to over 75 children. (This is a 50% increase from last year.)

This Service was extended at no charge and if compared to a private practice would easily have exceeded \$15,000.

Flag Football – This third year program offered by our department has continued to exceed our expectations. We currently have over 110 participants (boys and girls) on twelve teams in three different divisions.

Fall Soccer – Registration concluded Wednesday, July 31<sup>st</sup>.

Summer Programs – Our summer programming that includes day camp, swim camp, and public swimming concludes Friday, August 16<sup>th</sup>. We have had another successful summer serving over one hundred children a day among the three offerings.

Hinson Lake – Activity is substantial this time of year with current week-end reservations extending through the fall months.
