Consideration of Adoption of Resolution and Administrative Guidelines and Policies for the 2014 CDBG Infrastructure Program "2014 East Rockingham — Phase 3 Sewer Project" (requesting \$2,946,000 in grants funding with \$360,000 local match for a total project cost of \$3,306,000). After holding the Second Public Hearing (under item #7) to receive public input, the City has to formally adopt a resolution authorizing submission of the grant as well as administrative policies. These policies are attached separately for your review; however, they are being adopted under one "collective resolution". I would call your attention to the enclosed project description and preliminary cost estimates for this Phase 3 Sewer Project in the East Rockingham area. The proposed project area includes Homeward Street, Sandhill Road, School Street, Watkins Street, Pence Street and Stillwell Street. It will include approximately 15,000 LF of 8-inch sewer line and related appurtenances. If the funding for the project is approved, this project will benefit families struggling with failing septic tanks.

Re: Vacant Seat on Board of Adjustment and Vacant Seat on Historic Preservation Board

On February 4, 2014, Mark Rhyne submitted his written resignation from the Board of Adjustment. (Mr. Rhyne recently moved outside the city's ETJ and therefore is not eligible to remain a member of the Board.) As an ETJ member, Mark was appointed by the Richmond County Board of Commissioners and they will be responsible for appointing a replacement member. Typically, the City Council will make a recommendation to the Board of Commissioners regarding an appointment. Caroline Thomas Goodwin is currently the ETJ alternate member and has provided valuable input to the Board when called upon. City staff suggests the City Council recommend the Board of Commissioners move Ms. Goodwin to the ETJ regular member seat; and recommend a new member for appointment to the ETJ alternate seat.

On March 25, 2014, Thomas Hager submitted his written resignation from the Historic Preservation Board. (Mr. Hager has a monthly conflict on the same date and time as the Board's regular monthly meeting). City staff recommends the City Council appoint a new member to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Hager.

Dear Mayor Morris:

The Richmond County Health Department strongly endorses the City of Rockingham's effort to obtain a grant for funding assistance to provide much needed sewer service in the East Rockingham Community and surrounding areas. We have found that there is a need for such service and sincerely hope that a sewerage system can be extended in these areas.

Currently, many of the residences in these areas are utilizing on-site wastewater systems. This agency completed a sanitary survey of these areas and found a number of failing systems. There is a history of high water tables and marginal soils in these areas. We have documented numerous failing systems, particularly during times of wet weather. During these times in addition to regular septic tank pumping cost, the residents have been forced to install expensive repairs.

Some of the systems are failing due to age and lack of maintenance. Illegal surface discharge from kitchens and washing machines are common. In most cases the lot sizes are too small to repair these malfunctioning systems in accordance with state and local rules and regulations. We consider the conditions severe within the project area and a potential public health threat to the community.

We wish you success in securing CDBG funds to undertake this critically needed project. We pledge our support and assistance should your funding request be approved.

RESOLUTION APPROVING ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES AND POLICIES

FOR THE 2014 CDBG INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM "2014 EAST ROCKINGHAM - PHASE 3 SEWER PROJECT"

WHEREAS, the **City of Rockingham** wishes to carry out its 2014 CDBG Infrastructure Program in accordance with established state and federal administrative guidelines.

NOW THEREFORE, the **City of Rockingham City Council** hereby collectively adopts the following and resolves that they be utilized during the administration of the CDBG Infrastructure Program:

1. Resolution by the City of Rockingham City Council & Certification by Recording Officer

This resolution authorizes the submission of the 2014 CDBG Infrastructure Grant Application to NCDENR requesting \$2,946,000 in grant funds and providing a local match of \$360,000 for a total project cost of \$3,306,000.

2. <u>Citizen Participation Plan</u>

This plan describes how the City will involve citizens in the planning, implementation and assessment of the CDBG program.

3. Equal Employment and Procurement Plan

The plan states that the City provides equal employment opportunities for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, handicap, age, political affiliation, etc.

4. Language Access Plan

The purpose of this plan is to ensure compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and other applicable federal and state laws and their implementing regulations with respect to persons with limited English proficiency (LEP).

5. Flood Plain Certification

This certification ensures the proposed project is not located in a flood plain.

6. Section 519 Resolution

This resolution states the City prohibits the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations.

7. Residential AntiDisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan

Because the proposed project does not include any housing rehabilitation/relocation or demolition activities, this plan does not apply to the City of Rockingham. However, the State still requires all recipients of CDBG funds adopt this plan.

8. Section 3 Plan

This plan states the City will encourage local residents and business participation in undertaking community development activities. This plan describes steps to be taken to provide increased opportunities for local residents and businesses.



CITY OF ROCKINGHAM 2014 EAST ROCKINGHAM - PHASE 3 SEWER

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

In keeping with continued efforts to seek CDBG funding to further provide public sewer improvements to residents of the East Rockingham area, the City of Rockingham has plans to submit a CDBG Infrastructure Grant Application to NCDENR requesting \$2,946,000. East Rockingham residents are currently served by failing on-site septic tanks. Richmond County Health Department has provided documentation as such. The City of Rockingham is required to commit local funds in the amount of \$360,000 to provide for the connection of homes to the newly installed public sewer line and abandoned on-site septic tanks.

If funded, this project would provide public sewer improvements that would serve approximately 120 homes in the East Rockingham area. This includes the area of Homeward Street, Sandhill Road, School Street, Watkins Street, Pence Street and Stillwell Street. The project would include approximately 15,000 LF of 8-inch sewer line and related appurtenances.
