Consideration of Approval of Resolution to Sale Real Property, known as the Old City of Rockingham Library located at 302 Leak Street, Rockingham, NC 28379, in the amount of \$71,000.00 to Mr. & Mrs. William L. McDonald of Aberdeen, NC pursuant to N.C.G.S. 160A-270. (a).

In accordance with N.C.G.S. 160A-270. (a). the City accepted bids on the sale of real property known as the Old City of Rockingham Library located at 302 Leak Street, Rockingham, NC 28379, on May 24, 2018 at 10:30 A.M. in Council Chambers. The public hearing advertising of the sale required by law was duly published on April 12, 2018. The high bidder was Mr. & Mrs. William L. McDonald of Aberdeen, NC in the amount of \$71,000.00. The city has received the required 10% bid deposit of \$7,100.00 and it is recommended the Council approve this sale as presented. (See Page 15)

# City of Rockingham, North Carolina -- Notice of Public Hearing <u>Financing for Downtown Community College Building</u>

The City Council of the City of Rockingham, North Carolina, will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, June 12, 2018, at 7:30 p.m. (or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard). The purpose of the hearing is to take public comment concerning a proposed financing contract, under which the City would borrow approximately \$6,100,000 to pay for the acquisition, construction and equipping of a community college building.

The hearing will be held in the Council's usual meeting room, Rockingham City Hall, 514 Rockingham Road, Rockingham, North Carolina.

The proposed financing would be secured by a lien on the proposed new building (and its associated land), as well as the City's promise to repay the financing, but there would be no recourse against the City or its property (other than the pledged building and the associated land) if there were a default on the financing.

All interested persons will be heard. The City's plans are subject to change based on the comments received at the public hearing and the City Council's subsequent discussion and consideration. The City's entering into the financing is subject to obtaining approval from the North Carolina Local Government Commission.

# Resolution supporting an application to the Local Government Commission for its approval of a financing agreement - 2018 RCC Downtown Community College Building

#### WHEREAS ..

City of Rockingham has previously determined to carry out the acquisition and construction of a new downtown community college building. The City is carrying out this project in cooperation with Richmond County and Richmond Community College. The United States Department of Agriculture has offered to provide project financing to the City on an attractive long-term, flexible, low-interest basis.

The City Council desires to finance this project by the use of an installment financing, as authorized under Section 160A-20 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

Under the guidelines of the North Carolina Local Government Commission, this governing body must make certain findings of fact to support the City's application for the LGC's approval of the City's financing arrangements.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Rockingham, North Carolina, that the City makes a preliminary determination to finance approximately \$6,100,000 to pay capital costs of the proposed new downtown community college building.

The City Council will determine the final amount to be financed by a later resolution. The final amount financed may be slightly lower or slightly higher than \$6,100,000. Some of the financing proceeds may represent reimbursement to the City for prior expenditures on project costs, and some proceeds may be used to pay financing expenses or to provide any appropriate reserves.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council makes the following findings of fact:

- (1) The proposed project is necessary and appropriate for the City under all the circumstances. This project and its financing are the culmination of years of planning and cooperation between the City, the County and the College. The project will be an economic development benefit for the City and its residents.
- (2) The proposed installment financing is preferable to a bond issue for the same purposes. This financing is for a discrete facility, and is therefore particularly suitable for installment financing.

The City has no meaningful ability to issue non-voted general obligation bonds for this project. This project will produce no revenues that could be used to support a self-liquidating financing. The City expects that in the current interest rate environment for municipal securities there would be no material difference in the overall financing costs between general obligation bonds and installment financings for this project, especially given the attractive long-term financing package offered by USDA, which is also more flexible in its prepayment terms than traditional general obligations bonds would be.

- (3) The estimated sums to fall due under the proposed financing contract are adequate and not excessive for the proposed purpose. The City will closely review proposed financing rates against market rates with guidance from the LGC. All amounts financed will reflect either approved contracts or previous actual expenditures.
- (4) As confirmed by the City's Finance Officer, (i) the City's debt management procedures and policies are sound and in compliance with law, and (ii) the City is not in default under any of its debt service obligations.
- (5) The City expects that it will be able to pay its loan obligations for the project without an increase in City taxes. The City expects that the terms of the construction financing and long-term financing from USDA will allow the City to repay the financing within current resources. Given the expected benefits to the City and the community from this building, the City Council in any event believes that the expected costs to the City will be reasonable under all the circumstances.

(6) The City Attorney is of the opinion that the proposed project is authorized by law and is a purpose for which public funds of the City may be expended pursuant to the Constitution and laws of North Carolina.

#### BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED as follows:

- (a) The City intends that the adoption of this resolution will be a declaration of the City's official intent to reimburse project expenditures from financing proceeds. The City intends that funds that have been advanced for project costs, or which may be so advanced, from the City's general fund, or any other City fund, may be reimbursed from the financing proceeds.
- (b) The Council directs the City Manager to take all appropriate steps toward the completion of the financing, including (i) completing an application to the LGC for its approval of the proposed financing, and (ii) soliciting one or more proposals from financial institutions to provide construction financing. The City Council ratifies all prior actions of City representatives in this regard.
  - (c) This resolution takes effect immediately.



## RESOLUTION ADOPTING A POLICY FOR MUTUAL ASSISTANCE WITH OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes § 160A-288, the governing body of a town may adopt appropriate guidelines for the purpose of mutual assistance with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to said laws, the law enforcement assistance to be rendered authorizes lending officers to work temporarily with officers of the requesting agencies, including in an undercover capacity, and lending equipment and supplies; and

**WHEREAS**, it is deemed to be in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Rockingham to adopt a reasonable policy and guidelines whereby reciprocal law enforcement assistance can both be rendered to and obtained from other governmental jurisdictions; and

**WHEREAS**, such reciprocal assistance is necessary for effective law enforcement for the protection of the citizens of the City of Rockingham;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THIS \_\_\_\_ DAY OF\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_, by the City Council of the City of Rockingham, North Carolina, that:

- 1. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance arrangements with other municipal and county law enforcement agencies, provided that the head of the requesting law enforcement agency makes such request in writing;
- 2. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to permit officers of the City of Rockingham Police Department to work temporarily with officers of the requesting agency, including in an undercover capacity, and the Chief of Police may lend such equipment and supplies to requesting agencies as he deems advisable;
- 3. All such requests and authorizations shall be in accordance with North Carolina General Statutes § 160A-288, as applicable;
- 4. While working with a requesting agency, an officer shall have the same jurisdiction, powers, rights, privileges and immunities (including those relating to the defense of civil actions and payment of judgments) as the officers of the requesting agency in addition to those the officer normally possesses; and
- 5. While on duty with the requesting agency, an officer shall be subject to the lawful operational commands of the officer's superior officers in the requesting agency, but the officer shall for personnel and administrative purposes, remain under the control of the officer's own agency, including for purposes of pay. An officer shall furthermore be entitled to worker's compensation and the same benefits to the extent as though he were functioning within the normal scope of the officer's duties;
- 6. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to enter into mutual assistance agreements with other law enforcement agencies in accordance with such reasonable arrangements, terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the respective heads of the law enforcement agencies.

**SECTION 3. TAXES LEVIED.** There is hereby levied the Ad Valorem tax rate of \$.48 per \$100 valuation of taxable property, as listed for taxes as of January 1, 2018, for the purpose of raising revenues to finance the foregoing appropriations.
