Staff Report to Planning and Zoning Board

Issue:

Rezoning Request: Neal Smith Engineering, LLC has submitted an application to rezone approximately 16.87 acres located on the northwest and northeast corners of the intersection of Mizpah Road and US Highway 74 Bypass and identified as Richmond County PIN 7461-01-29-3319 from Light Industrial (I-1) to Heavy Industrial (I-2).

Background:

On May 19, 2022, Neal Smith Engineering submitted a request to rezone approximately 16.87 acres located on the northwest and northeast corners of the intersection of Mizpah Road and US Highway 74 Bypass from Light Industrial (I-1) to Heavy Industrial (I-2). The subject property is currently vacant except for a Duke Energy transmission line that crosses most of the subject property located on the northeast corner of the intersection and a small portion of the subject property on the northwest corner. The applicant has indicated their intent to develop a concrete production facility on the subject property.

As set forth in Section 3.01 (M) of the UDO, the Light Industrial (I-1) zone is generally intended to accommodate and provide areas for wholesale activities, industrial research, warehousing and light manufacturing operations. The regulations for such district are intended to promote sound, permanent, light industrial development and to protect abutting and surrounding areas from any undesirable impacts of such development.

As set forth in Section 3.01 (L) of the UDO, the Heavy Industrial (I-2) zone is generally intended to accommodate and provide for intensive industrial activities that create some level of nuisance. The regulations for such district are intended to protect the community from undesirable characteristics associated with heavy industrial uses, while still allowing for economic growth.

Staff Comments:

1. A zoning map and an aerial map illustrating the location of the subject property are included in the agenda packet for the Board's reference.
2. The subject property is located in the City's ETJ. The subject property was identified as part of a larger area to encourage industrial development during land use planning 25 years ago when the City received special legislation to extend its ETJ to include the area around the then new US Highway 1/Highway 74 Bypass interchange.

Plan Consistency Statement:

The requested rezoning is consistent with the future land use map set forth in *Shaping Our Future: 2033*. The future land use map in *Shaping Our Future: 2033* identifies the subject property as part of an area to encourage industrial development.

Statement of Reasonableness:

The proposed rezoning is of sufficient size to not constitute a spot zoning situation. The subject property is located in a sparsely developed area of the ETJ; is bisected by an interstate highway and multiple electric transmission lines; and is part of a larger area identified 25 years ago as an area to encourage industrial development. Therefore, the proposed rezoning is a reasonable request.

Staff Recommendation:

City staff recommends the Board review the proposed rezoning request and recommend the City Council rezone the property as requested by the applicant.

Planning Board Recommendation:

The Planning Board reviewed the request and recommended unanimously that the City Council rezone the subject property as requested.

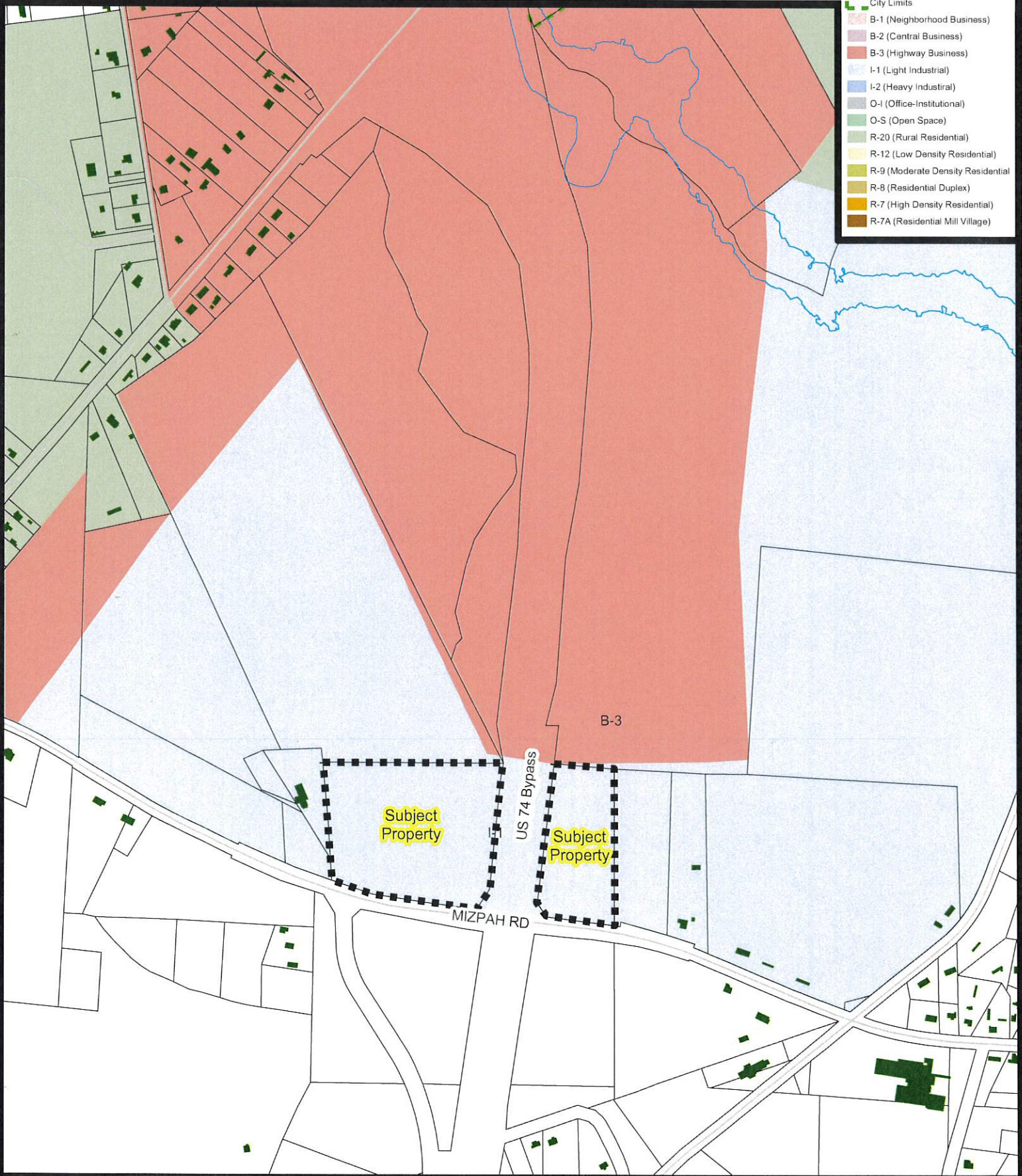

Re: Demolition Ordinance for Dilapidated Dwelling located at **48 3rd Avenue Pee Dee**

City staff recommends the City Council approve a demolition ordinance for the dilapidated dwelling located at 48 3rd Avenue Pee Dee and identified as Richmond County PIN 7463-11-76-0496. A copy of the demolition ordinance and photographs of the property are included in the agenda packet.

As background information, City staff initiated minimum housing proceedings in January of 2026. The property owner, Donald William Eanes and all parties of interest were notified of a hearing with the Code Enforcement Officer regarding the condition of the dwelling. The notice was sent via certified and regular mail; published in the Richmond County Daily Journal; and posted on the subject property. Donald Eanes and Kim Brigman attended the hearing with the Code Enforcement Officer. The Code Enforcement Officer issued his findings of fact and directed the property owner to either repair or demolish the dwelling by April 21, 2026. Again, the notice was sent via certified and regular mail; published in the Richmond County Daily Journal; and posted on the subject property. The property owner has taken no action to date to address the dilapidated dwelling.

AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE BUILDING INSPECTOR TO REMOVE OR DEMOLISH THE PROPERTY HEREIN DESCRIBED AS UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION AND DIRECTING THAT A NOTICE BE PLACED THEREON THAT THE SAME MAY NOT BE OCCUPIED.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rockingham finds that the dwelling described herein is unfit for human habitation under the City Housing Code, and that all the procedures of the Housing Code have been complied with; and

WHEREAS, this dwelling should be removed or demolished, as directed by the Building Inspector, and should be placarded by placing thereon a notice prohibiting use for human habitation; and

WHEREAS, the owners of this dwelling, the Donald William Eanes has been given a reasonable opportunity to bring the dwelling up to the standards of the Housing Code in accordance with G.S. 160D-1203 pursuant to an order issued by the Building Inspector on January 21, 2026 and the owners has failed to comply with the order;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Rockingham, that:

- Section 1. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to place a placard containing the legend *"This building is unfit for human habitation; the use or occupation of this building for human habitation is prohibited and unlawful."* on the building located at 48 3rd Avenue Pee Dee and identified by Richmond County PIN# 7463-11-76-0496.
- Section 2. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to proceed to remove or demolish the above-described dwelling in accordance with his order to the owner thereof dated January 21, 2026 and in accordance with the Housing Code and G.S. 160D-1203.
- Section 3. (a) The cost of removal or demolition shall constitute a lien against the real property upon which the cost was incurred. The lien shall be filed in the office of the City Tax Collector and City Clerk, and shall have the same priority and be collected in the same manner as the lien for special assessments in Article 10 of G.S. Chapter 160A.
- (b) Upon completion of the required removal or demolition, the Building Inspector shall sell the materials of the dwelling and credit the proceeds against the cost of removal or demolition. The Building Inspector shall certify the remaining balance to the Tax Collector. If a surplus remains after sale of the materials and satisfaction of the cost of removal or demolition, the Building Inspector shall deposit the surplus in the Superior Court where it shall be secured and disbursed in the manner provided by G.S 160D-1203.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or cause to be removed the placard from any building to which it is affixed. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any building therein declared to be unfit for human habitation.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.
