What is a Hybrid School? Building on the Pillars of Faith and Family

Core courses

- •All students attend core courses on Wednesdays and Fridays
- •Biology and Chemistry meet on every other Monday in addition to Wednesday and Friday

•Electives are held on Mondays

•Robotics, Entrepreneurship, SAT Prep, Writing & Rhetoric, Art, Advanced Logic, Debate, Civics

•Why does this model work?

- •Students are set up at a young age to learn time management skills, balancing priorities and establish an independent work ethic
- •There will be an adjustment period for those students who are new to the Hybrid Model
 - •This is normal and expected

At Home Days This is not a FREE day!

- With the hybrid school structure your students will be home 2-3 days during the work week
- These are independent work days
- Students should expect to have at least one hour of work per core course per a day
- Make sure your student is keeping up with their studies during the At Home Days

What are my options as a parent?


- It is up to each individual family to decide how to help their student manage information transmitted via Google Classroom
- You can ask your student for their log-in or request that the teacher add you to the Google Classroom




Google Classroom What does it look like?

- Select the individual Classroom you would like to enter

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


Settings

- Check for regular communication from teachers and staff






Hybrid Education, Catholic Values

- At Saint John Bosco School, it is part of our mission to provide an environment to our students, where they can openly seek the Good, the True and the Beautiful, within an atmosphere of respect and accountability
- The Catholic faith is at the heart of all aspects of Saint John Bosco School, from daily prayer and weekly mass and confessions, to participation in activities such as The March for Life
- We will host an Altar Server and Lector Training the first month of school
- This year we have two retreats planned during Advent and Lent
 - In addition to two Stations of the Cross during Lent
- Our students are consistently experiencing the breadth and beauty of the Catholic faith throughout their experiences at SJBS

Uniform Requirements Formal Uniform

- •Modesty: Students are expected to dress in a manner that represents the values imbued in every aspect of our school.
 - Ladies: SJBS skirt that falls at the knee, blouse or polo, socks/tights and dress shoes or solid white sneakers
 - •Gentleman: Dress pants, button down shirt, tie and dress shoes or solid white sneakers
 - •Optional Uniform: Students are permitted to wear the SJBS crewneck sweatshirt, SJBS 1/4 zip or a solid color cardigan or 1/4 zip in school colors (Navy and Grey)

Uniform Requirements Monday Uniform

•Mondays are Dress Down Days, This DOES NOT mean Wear Anything You Want Days

Students are permitted to wear any of the SJBS spirit wear

- •Bottoms: Shorts that are of a modest length or sweatpants in solid Black, Grey or Navy (small logos are permitted)
- •Tops: Solid color short sleeve or long sleeve t-shirts in a neutral color (small logos are permitted)
 - •We will NOT allow any graphic shirts or sweatshirts this year that are not SJBS spirit wear
 - •Sweatshirts can be crewneck or hoodies in a solid Black, Grey or Navy (small logos are permitted)
- •Shoes: Sneakers or dress shoes of any kind (Crocs and slides are not permitted)
