

 - •Communicate with your teachers and stay connected to your student


At Home Days This is not a FREE day!

Handbook Highlights

What every student needs to know!

- •Honesty: SJBS students are expected to uphold the honor code.
 - •On my honor I pledge that I have neither given nor received any unauthorized assistance on this assignment. -Student Signature
 - •Violation of the honor code will result in an automatic zero on the assignment and detention
- •Focus: While our outside world asks us to focus on social media, we seek to remain focused on God.
 - Use of cell phones, iPads or other unauthorized devices is prohibited
 - 1st violation, the device is confiscated and returned to the parents
 - •Each additional violation will result in a \$25 fine to the family account

Uniform Requirements

- •Modesty: Students are expected to dress in a manner that represents the values imbued in every aspect of our school.
 - Ladies: SJBS skirt that falls at the knee, blouse or polo, socks/tights and dress shoes
 - •Gentleman: Dress pants, button down shirt, tie and dress shoes
 - •Winter Uniform: Students are permitted to wear the SJBS crewneck sweatshirt, SJBS 1/4 zip or a solid color cardigan or 1/4 zip in school colors
