


# How to add 'Rulers to Photoshop

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To add a Ruler to any Photoshop Project... You will need to follow these three steps:


## Step 1:

- Go to 'View' at the top of Photoshop and select 'Rulers'. This will add rulers to the top, and left sides of your project.




## Step 2

- Once you've selected 'Rulers' You will notice that two rulers appear on your project.
- We will refer to them as 'Top Measurement' and 'Left Measurement'.
- You may have to right-click on the ruler on Photoshop to change the measurement type to the desired type. (Example: Changing from Pixels to Inches)



### Step 3

- Once you've got the right measurement type, now is time to add your ruler.
- To add a ruler, you must move your cursor to the left, or top measurement, left-click and hold as you drag the mouse down.
- To remove a ruler, simply take the 'Move Tool' and drag it off the screen.
