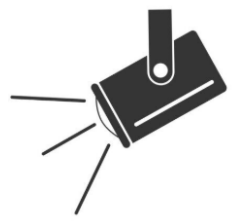

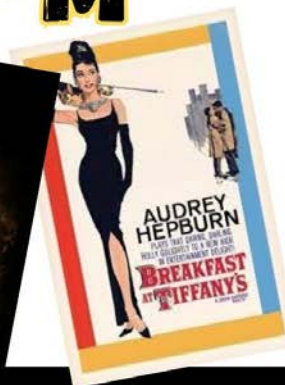

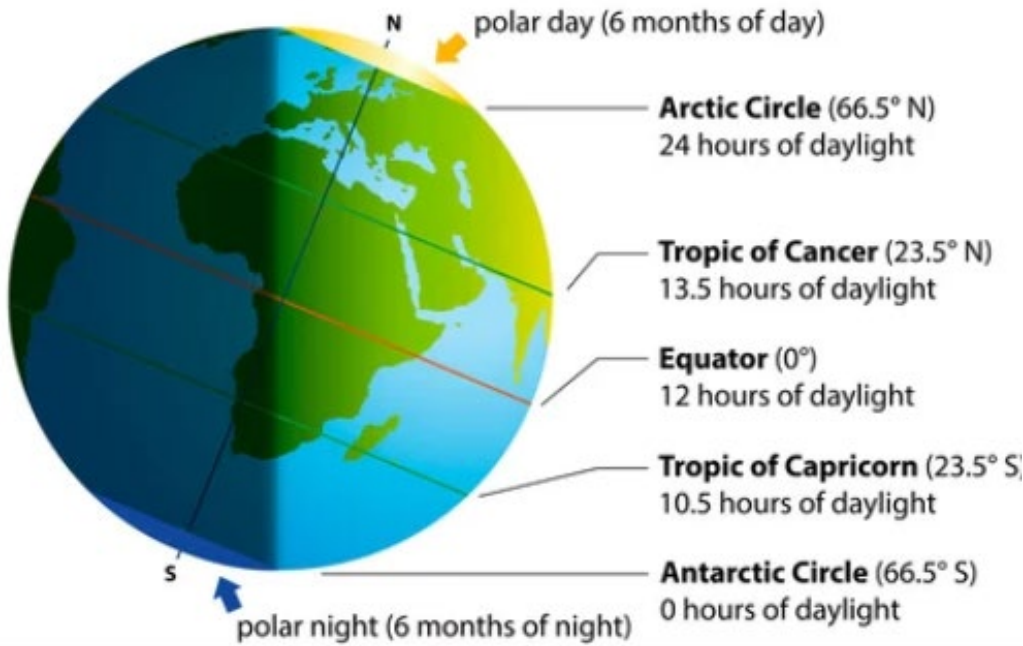

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

Mt. Wilson Lane Road Closure



Mt. Wilson Lane

Baltimore County Department of Public Works and Transportation is notifying area residents of a temporary road closure on Mt. Wilson Lane in Pikesville on or about July 7, 2025. The closure will be in effect between Yeshiva Lane and the entrance to the Villages at Woodholme. The closure is in place to permit the replacement of a culvert that crosses Mt. Wilson Lane. The culvert replacement is anticipated to take approximately 3-4 weeks and detours will be provided for the duration of construction. Emergency services has been notified of the planned closure and access will be maintained for all essential services throughout construction. Residents will also maintain access to their homes via the provided detours.
