## FALSE FLOOR



### SEASONAL ITEMS & EXTRA STORAGE

False or concealed floors can be used to store pantry items such as canned goods or seasonal products like winter jackets. Even items like tools, fishing equipment, or extra toilet paper can be stored here as well.

## WINDOWSILL TABLE

### EATING/STUDY/DECOR

A windowsill table that folds away demonstrates the multipurpose uses of the space - including using as a dining table or desk. Having the table temporary helps to avoid the temptation for unnecessary clutter to accumulate.

## STORAGE BUILT WITHIN STAIRS

### FROM THE FRIDGE, CLOTHING TO PET TOYS

Traditional tiny homes have a loft bedroom, and therefore need a set of stairs to reach. Build storage units into them so they may hold ... plants, clothing or a even a fridge!



## DUAL USE BATHROOM CABINETRY

### COMPACT DESIGN REQUIRES SIMPLICITY

Within a small bathroom space you can have a floating sink and underneath a short closed storage unit that houses the waste/recycling bin and the toilet paper holder. While keeping other items such as toothpaste and floss in a mirrored medicine cabinet above the sink.

### WE DON'T NEED A LAUNDRY ROOM

Many appliances in tiny homes are being built into the walls or storage cabinets. One great space-saving alternative is to purchase a dual washing machine and dryer (one unit).
