All-Star Cheer Parent Code of Conduct

3. Competition Behavior for Parents

- Positive Attitude: Cheer and support all athletes, not just your own child, during competitions and events. Maintain a positive and encouraging attitude toward all competitors.
- Respect for Officials and Coaches: Always show respect to judges, officials, and other coaches during competitions. Do not engage in confrontations or disagreements with officials.

4. Respect for Coaches and Gym Staff
