## SUNDAY 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2021 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

**Gospel**.: Mark 10: 2-16 Today's reading from Mark's Gospel, taken with Mt 5:31-32; Mt 19:3-9; Lk 16:18; and 1 Cor 7:10-11, is the main source from which the Catholic Church derives Jesus' teaching on the Sacramental nature of marriage and its indissolubility. Christian marriage involves both a sacred and legal contract between a man and woman and at the same time is rooted in a special Covenant with the Lord. That is why Jesus states that a valid marriage is permanent. Hence, the Church has always firmly taught that a Sacramental marriage between Christians in which there has been true matrimonial consent and consummation, is indissoluble, except by the death of one of the spouses. Of course, it is not always easy for the two partners in a marriage to get along with each other because marriage though one of the most fulfilling of all relationships is also one of the most demanding. The husband and wife bring to the marriage their strengths and weaknesses. Hence, the first requisite for a lasting marriage is that the spouses learn to accept each other as they are: two imperfect and vulnerable human beings. They are God's gift to each other: "*I will make a suitable partner for him.*" They must learn that healing the wounds of family life is as necessary as healing the wounds in the body.

All the same, when the marriage relationship breaks down and reconciliation is not possible (especially when there is impediment), the Church recognizes the right of the couple to separate and live apart permanently.
