SUNDAY 15th August 2021 The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Year B)

<u>Gospel</u>.: On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII proclaimed the dogma of Assumption: "The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory".

Assumption comes from the Latin word "assumere" which means "to take up". Scriptures give evidence of the possibility of bodily assumption. In Genesis 5:24, we read that Enoch walked in close fellowship with God and was taken away by God. Similarly, Elijah was taken up to heaven by a whirlwind (2 Kings 2:11).

The Assumption of Mary manifests the power and promise of the resurrection. Paul describes Jesus as the first fruits of all who have fallen asleep (see: 2ndR, 1 Cor. 15: 20-26). Mary is part of the harvest of the first fruits and the assumption is her share in her Son's victory over every sovereignty and power, sin and death. As believers in the resurrection of the body, it is also a foreshadowing of what awaits us.

Reflecting on the ways we should think of Mary's role in our lives, St Thomas Villanova invites us to invoke her as an advocate, and to sign off our prayers with the invocation: O loving Advocate, defend my case! May we always come to our beloved Mother Mary -Our Advocate and she will help us to live according to our Christian vocations and join her to behold the glory of the Lord at the end of our lives.

<u>Lateral Flow Testing Kits</u> Everyone in England is now being encouraged to take two rapid coronavirus tests a week under the government's testing programme. Regular testing for people without symptoms is an important tool, alongside 'hands, face, space, vaccinations and fresh air', in allowing us to move safely forward as we ease out of lockdown. We now have a supply of lateral flow kits for parishioners which can provide results in around 30 minutes. Please help yourself to a pack which contains 7 test kits, at the back of church. People with Covid symptoms should NOT take a rapid test. Instead, please stay at home and book a PCR test online or by calling 119.
