## SUNDAY 29<sup>th</sup> August 2021 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel.: Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Gospel explains the encounter of Jesus with the Sanhedrin observers and the Pharisees who had found Jesus' teachings an open violation of the Traditions of the elders. They also noticed that Jesus' disciples omitted the required ritual washing before meals.

It was in the fifth century BC that the scribes started adding oral traditions as interpretations and practical applications of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees observed them and insisted that all the Jews should do so. The original noble purpose was to sanctify the daily lives of the people, making them "holy as God is holy" ("You are a priestly kingdom, a holy nation" - Ex 19:6), and different in lifestyle from their pagan neighbours.

Jesus used the occasion to teach, and He pointed out that: Sincerity of heart, internal disposition, purity, and holiness are more important than mere external ritual observances. Secondly the observance of traditions and of washing rituals does not correct the internal motivations and inclinations that really defile people. And finally External piety without internal holiness is hypocrisy.

<u>Lateral Flow Testing Kits</u> Everyone in England is now being encouraged to take two rapid coronavirus tests a week under the government's testing programme. Regular testing for people without symptoms is an important tool, alongside 'hands, face, space, vaccinations and fresh air', in allowing us to move safely forward as we ease out of lockdown. We now have a supply of lateral flow kits for parishioners which can provide results in around 30 minutes. Please help yourself to a pack which contains 7 test kits, at the back of church. People with Covid symptoms should NOT take a rapid test. Instead, please stay at home and book a PCR test online or by calling 119.
