SUNDAY 5th September 2021 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel.: Mark 7:31-37

In today's Gospel Jesus heals a deaf and dumb man, who was brought to him (see: today's gospel, Mark 7:31-37). It was clear that the man was doubly-challenged – suffering from disabilities and also regarded as an outcast. However, his moment came – a fortuitous moment – which brought to fulfilment Isaiah's messianic prophecy: "Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed" (1st R, Isaiah 35:4-7).

Jesus took some unusual steps to perform this miracle: 1) He leads the man away from the crowd, 2) puts His fingers into the man's ears, 3) spits on His own fingers, 4) touches the man's tongue with the spittle, 5) looks up to Heaven, 6) sighs, and 7) speaks the healing command: "Ephphatha", "Be opened". With these actions and gestures and a word of power, he frees the man from his impairments.

We deduce that this miracle is symbolic of our own spiritual deafness – our reluctance to listen to God's voice. In his _Confessions_ , a spiritual autobiography, St Augustine likens his condition before his conversion to deafness: "Late have I loved you, O beauty so ancient and so new; late have I loved you! For behold you were within me, and I outside; and I sought you outside...You were with me, and I was not with you. ...You called and cried to me and broke open my deafness" (Book 7).

Breaking open our deafness is essential to both our spiritual journey and growth, and as fully functioning human beings. Returning the man's power of speech also means that we can be healed of the inability to speak words of praise, apology, and appreciation.
