Pastoral Letter: A pastoral letter from Bishop Mark on Saint John Henry Newman, Doctor of the Church will be read at all Masses on the Solemnity of All Saints this weekend 1st/2nd November. Copies are available in the porch.

Month of Holy Souls: The month of November is a special time when we remember all our loved ones. If there are any loved ones who have died that you would like prayers for, you may use the special envelopes in the porch, or your own envelopes, to give the list of deceased members of your family and any offering. A box containing the names of departed loved ones to be prayed for will be placed at the altar during all Masses in November. If you would like a Mass offered for a deceased loved one, please use the Mass Offering envelop and follow the usual procedure.

Monday 3rd November – All Souls Day: There will be Masses at 10am and 6.30pm to remember and pray for all the faithful departed. The blessing of the graves of our loved ones at Whitchurch cemetery will take place after 10am Mass.

First Holy Communion: May we ask all parents who wish their child to make the First Reconciliation and the First Holy communion this school year, and is in Year 3 and above, to collect the enrolment form by 17th November from Fr Francis or email parish office. The **Enrolment Mass and introductory meeting will be on Sunday 23rd November at 11.am.** We would like to form a team of catechists for the sacramental preparations in our parish, especially for the First Holy Communion. If you are available to help, please speak to Fr Francis or email parish office.

Parish Accounts: We thank Richard Shrimplin & Tony Livesey who keep a record of our parish receipts and payments. They have given us an update of the total receipts and payments in the last 6 months, up to 30th September 2025: total receipts £14,479.75 and total payments £18,862.32. (Our annual receipts 2024-2025 amounted to £32,400 and annual payments £40,627.) Currently our average running costs each month are £2735, and our average monthly income is £1946; an average shortfall of £789 each month. One of the ways which makes a difference is to gift aid your current contribution if you don't already. For every £1 given 25p is received back from HMRC. If you would like to know more about how to gift aid or perhaps start a monthly standing order, rather than donate in the collection bag, then please contact Richard or Tony or email the parish office.

Livestream/Webcam: It was installed during the Covid lockdown and it has been a great help for us when we could not be physically present for the Eucharistic Celebration and perhaps it continues to serve those who are housebound. Currently £257.12 are deducted from our account each month (£184.50 for Church TV services and £72.62 for Broadband service only to support the livestream. We would greatly appreciate your opinion on this service, especially from those of our parishioners who still use and rely on it. You can give your feedback to Tony or Gordon or email the parish office. Your views on this service are important as we review the viability of continuing with the livestream.

Church Heating: Due to safety reasons we had to disconnect the gas connection to the church boiler. We have received a few quotes for the replacement of existing boiler and radiators and we hope to be able to install them at the earliest. It is also our priority to upgrade the lighting inside the church. We will keep you updated about any progress in this regard.

Parish Christmas Meal at ETZIO: Friday 5th December at 5.30pm. The sign-up form for the parish meal is in the porch. Please add your name to the form so we can gauge numbers wanting to attend. The cost is £19.00 for a starter and main course. Please take a menu and return the menus with your name, contact number and correct money to the presbytery by 17th November. Everyone is invited. What gives us life and energy as a Parish is when we come together spiritually and socially.
