Subject: Developing a Healthy Self-Esteem (Jeremiah 1:5 KJV)

Scripture Passage:

"Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations."

Introduction:

In the scripture used for our lesson last week and this week, we hear the Lord saying to Jeremiah, "I knew you before I formed you in the womb, I set you apart, and I appointed you.
