MISSION: Atlanta High School Art Exhibition (AHSAE) encourages young artists to reinvent and take risks with their art. Instructors are encouraged to submit unique, non-traditional as well as traditional work created by their students. Artworks are judged as work produced by high school students and not as professional art in general. There is no theme. Work is judged on the criteria of **originality, creativity, follow through, and good craftsmanship.**

JURY PROCESS: The jury uses a blind process: judges see the jpg image of the work, the artist's year in school and details about the work - without knowing the school or instructor. Information about the work (media, size, etc.) is also made available to the jury.

AWARDS: Award winners will be selected on March 28. Awarding of the prizes is at the discretion of the judges. Winners will be announced on March 30 (categories below)

Best in Show

1st, 2nd, 3rd awarded in: **Ceramics, Drawing, Graphic Design, Jewelry, Mixed Media, Painting, Photography, Printmaking, Sculpture.**

The Georgia Watercolor Society will offer awards to works created in water-based media. (1st Place \$200, 2nd Place \$100, 3rd Place \$75 & 2 Honorable Mentions of \$25 each). We welcome continued collaboration with this outstanding organization.

STEPS TO ENTER:

Step 1: Eligibility

- High School Students: Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, and Senior. Home schooled students are welcome.
- Work must have been created on the school site or related to the school curriculum between March 1, 2025, and March 2, 2026. Work produced during the Governor's Honors, portfolio center, and independent art programs are ineligible. Although we realize that sections of a work are often created off campus, the majority of the art should be produced under the supervision of their high school teacher.
- **Original work only**, copies of famous art or copies from published work on the internet are ineligible. **Please read the attached document concerning artistic plagiarism.**
- **Works created by, or copied from Artificial Intelligence sources are ineligible.**
- **It is the responsibility of the teacher submitting to know the source of the work submitted and confirm the student's submission is, to the best of their knowledge, authentic student work.**

Step 2: Choose Work and Photograph

- By entering my students' work, I agree that I will be responsible for picking up accepted work at the end of the Atlanta Dogwood Festival, April 12, by 5 pm at the Community Center, Piedmont Park (In the same building as Willy's Mexicana Grill).
- Each teacher may enter up to 8 artworks, one entry per student. If a student takes more than one fine art class from more than one teacher, only one work by that student may be submitted. Work can be in any medium (painting, drawing, printmaking, jewelry, mixed media, photography, sculpture, pottery, graphic design including digital manipulation, fashion, architectural design, etc.) Realizing that 3-D works will be handled several times, please make sure that all 3-D work submitted is sturdy enough to be packed and repacked for award selection and for display at the show.
- Photograph your entries and save as jpeg. Do not digitally alter the images; make sure that the submission best represents the original work.
- 2-D work does not exceed 48 inches in one direction
- 3-D work does not exceed 24x24x24 inches and not over 20 lbs

Step 3: Name the Image File

- **The File Name for jpg (images)** as follows:

school(hyphen)instructorlastname(hyphen)artistlastname(hyphen)artis

in inches for 2D & 3D (Height x Width x Depth x Weight in inches and lbs) (*You may
abbreviate the medium, i.e., AoC, CH, OoC, PN, W, O, etc.*

For instance:

or a 3D piece:

2. Parkview-Scott-Artist-Sophomore-Gnome-clay-18x24x12-14 lb.jpg

- Image files should be less than 2.25 MB. The resolution (pixels per inch) of the file is not important; make sure the images you submit are larger than 1024x768 without breaching the 2.25 MB limit. For 3D work submit front and side images.
- *Do not misrepresent the art (no fancy Photoshop corrections, please) Submit an additional close-up of detailed work that may be overlooked in a larger image.*

Step 4: Fill Out ONE form for each entry

We are using a google form for entry. Entry form is [**here**](#). Attach the image at the bottom of the form. Fill out one form for each entry.

Step 5: Submit Work

- Please submit your work **by 5 p.m. on Monday, March 2, 2026**. We encourage you not to wait until the last day to submit.

Step 6: Jury the Show

- Our panel of jurors will view work on March 8 & Notification of Accepted work will be emailed to you by March 9.

Step 7: Prep Accepted Entries

- Prepare your accepted entries for delivery as follows:
 - **2-D Work:** Matboard or mounted (White matboard only, do not mount or mat with poster board); ready to hang; **work must be exhibit ready.** No glass: Plexiglass only (if necessary).
 - **Attach artwork entry form to the back of each piece.** Orient the form on the back so that the piece will hang with the correct orientation. Contact us if you have questions about how to present your entries.
 - **3-D work:** it must be delivered in a **box with a lid**. Place a **picture of the work** on the box, labeled with student name, school, and entry form.

Step 8: Delivery of Work

- Work accepted to the show is to be delivered between March 10 - March 21 at any of the following locations:

 4. **Alex Scott-247 Kings Highway, Decatur, GA** (After 5PM - Evenings only)
