THE ANNOUNCER!

The readings of today draw us to reflect on the impact of the virtue of humility in our practice of faith. Humility is at the foundation of faith. Without faith, no one can know God, yet without humility, no one can practice faith. God is interested in those who are lowly and humble in heart.

In the first reading, the prophet Zephaniah calls the people to seek the Lord, seek righteousness and humility. He calls them to the real practice of faith, which should humble them before God's presence. He refers to them as the "humble and lowly people", who take refuge in God rather than in power, deceit, lies and injustice. He prophesies that they shall be the fearless remnant of Israel after the day of the Lord's anger.

In the second reading, St Paul in his first letter to the Corinthians speaks of the lowly state of those who have been called when viewed according to the world's standards. He reminds them that most of them were not wise, powerful, or influential by worldly standards when they were called. Yet God deliberately chose what is foolish, weak, and lowly to reveal His strength. The purpose is clear: "so that no human being might boast in the presence of God." If we must boast, it should be in the Lord.

In the Gospel according to Matthew, we hear Jesus speak the beatitudes to all those gathered around him, who represent all who seek God and live the life of God. God's kingdom will be theirs. They will be comforted in sorrow. They will inherit the earth. They shall be satisfied. They shall receive mercy. They shall see God and be called sons of God. Jesus declares this "blessedness" on the poor in spirit, the meek, the merciful, the pure of heart, the peacemakers, and those persecuted for their faith. One beautiful thing about all these people is that they have humbled themselves before God.

No one can truly practice virtue and be blessed in the presence of God except if they humble themselves. Humility is essential in our human nature. It is essential in our faith. Are you boastful in your successes, possessions or reputation? Where do you think that you need more humility in your life?


