30th November 2025 1st Sunday in Advent (All) Psalter Week 1

THE ANNOUNCER!

Today, we begin a new liturgical year with the season of Advent, a time of hopeful waiting, prayerful preparation, and joyful expectation for the coming of Christ. Advent reminds us that Christ has already come in history, that He comes to us daily in grace, and that He will come again in glory. Those who are spiritually awake or prepared will meet Him when He visits us. So, we are invited to wake up, open our hearts and walk in God's light.

Isaiah, in the first reading, prophesied about the future, saying that all nations will stream toward the mountain of the Lord, seeking His ways and His peace. Swords will be beaten into ploughshares and spears into pruning hooks, meaning that tools of violence will become tools of life. This prophecy is about the coming of the Son of Man. To work towards making it a reality, he invites us to come and walk in the light of the Lord.

St. Paul, in the second reading, urged his listeners and us to wake up from spiritual slumber. "The night is far gone, the day is at hand." He urged us to walk properly as in the daytime, casting off the works of darkness. Jesus, the sun of justice will shine like the daylight on us. Advent is all about this spiritual alertness, this spiritual walk in God's light of holiness and grace as we await Christ's coming.

In the Gospel, Jesus reminded His disciples of the days of Noah, how people were so busy with daily life that they failed to notice God's call to walk in his light. That is how the coming of the Son of Man will be. Many people may just be living their lives and not preparing for Him. This message is not intended to frighten us, but to always keep us aware and ready. Jesus will come suddenly like a thief in the night.

The Lord's coming at Christmas, in our daily life, and at the end of time is a blessing and worth celebrating. Make room for Jesus now. Live with the dignity of His presence. Let His light shape your desires, your lifestyle, and your choices. As we begin this time of preparation for Christmas, may our hearts be awake with hope, faith, joy and love.
