


Enterprise Fund Admin. Charges


Enterprise Fund Administrative Charges to General Fund

- Rate increase for water and sewer to account for:
 - Increase operations costs
 - Increase debt service in Water/Sewer Fund
 - Increase sewer processing costs
- Use \$0 in fund balance to balance budget

Proposed 2024-2025 Budget

Revenues

- Projected to increase marginally with new natural gas customers coming online. Natural gas revenues are heavily reliant on weather.
- Staff is currently reviewing the availability fee structure.



Natural Gas Fund Highlights- Expenditures

Proposed 2024-2025 Budget



Expenditures

- Minimal debt service continues to the Natural Gas Fund. This may change as capital investments are made as we grow the system and connect to new projects.
- New line to Trinity Capital site from Southridge Parkway
- Administrative transfers from the Natural Gas Fund will more accurately reflect actual costs
- Allocated funding to build back fund balance (cash flow and audit)

Stormwater Fund Highlights- Revenues



Proposed 2024-2025 Budget

Revenues

- In 2021, City Council voted to implement new stormwater fees based off the City's Stormwater Fee Study. The plan included new stormwater fees, based off impervious surfaces, to go into effect January 1, 2024.
- I recommended with the adoption of the 2023-2024 Budget, to postpone this implementation of new fees until July 1, 2024 (2024-2025 budget)

Expenditures

- Stormwater Master Plan (grant funded)
- New Position: Stormwater Manager
- New revenues will cover costs of stormwater position

Revenues

• Projected to marginally increase from years prior. State Street Aid (or Powell Bill) funds comes from state gasoline taxes.

Proposed 2024-2025 Budget

Expenditures

- The Proposed 2024-2025 Budget does not include new street paving. Expenditures primarily include general resurfacing, patching and debt service.
- Future paving needs should be considered as debt service rolls off to address needed street repairs.


