
Anti-Discrimination policy:

Initial Meeting

- After your student has been paired with a tutor, an initial meeting with all parents should be established
- Tutors should cover an outline of their curriculum, student interests/current knowledge, tutoring schedule, homework etc.
- Feel free to ask any questions to your child's tutor if needed as this meeting is meant to help both parents and students better understand the logistics of tutoring



Tutor Expectations

- Tutors must be committed to teaching at least 8 weeks
- Tutors must have their cameras on, this is not required for students.
- If tutors encounter a one-on-one situation, a parent/guardian must supervise the meeting or the tutor may record the meeting which will be available on request
- Tutors must address all parent/guardians if any changes are to be made within the group
