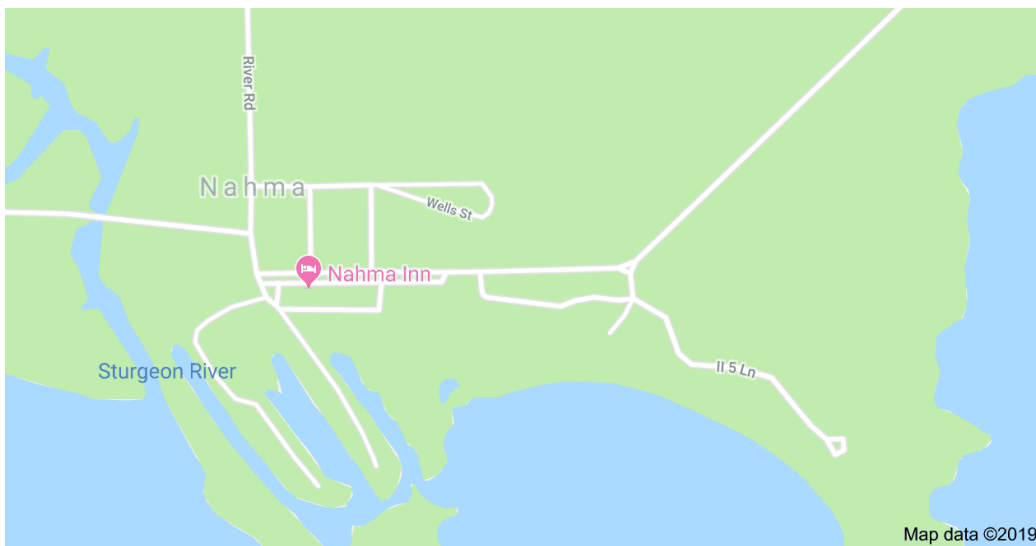

We hope you have a wonderful stay at Stony Point Cabins. In this information guide, you'll find some of the most talked about and sought after locations along with some hidden gems only the locals know about.

Grocery and Convenience Stores nearest to furthest:

Foxy's Den: A small convenience store and gas station. It is a 15 min. drive (approx. 10 miles from the resort). It has basic necessities.

Directions: 16201 US Highway 2 Cooks, MI 49817

Turn right at the end of our private road and take 495 to US 2 (5 miles), turn right. Foxy's is 4.6 miles on the right.

Dollar General: Is across the street from Foxy's

Shell Gas Station and Market: A small grocery store and gas station. It is a 22 min. Drive (approx. 18 miles from the resort). This location has fresh cut and smoked meat, a small produce section and basic necessities.

Directions: 6504 00.25 Rd. Garden, MI 49835

Turn right at the end of our private road and take 495 to US 2 (5 miles), turn right. Turn right on 00.25 Rd. (about 4.6 miles). You will pass Foxy's and head into Garden Corners. The destination will be on the left about 8.3 miles down.

Jack's Fresh Market: A beautiful full service grocery store. This supermarket has it all! It's clean and has a large variety of specialty items. It is a 30 min. drive (approx. 26 miles from resort).

Directions: 735 E. Lakeshore Dr. Manistique, MI 49854 Turn right at the end of our private road and take 495 to US 2 (5 miles). Turn right on US 2, Jack's will be on the left (about 20 miles).

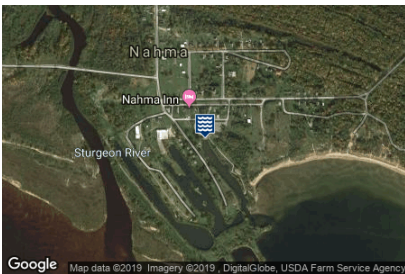
Meijer: This is a newer location in Escanaba! It is a 45 min. Drive (approx. 34 miles from resort)

Directions: 505 N. 26th St. Escanaba, MI 49829 Turn left at the end of our private road and head into the town of Nahma. You will pass the Nahma Inn, which is a great restaurant and bar. Turn left on EE.25 Rd (before the park). Take EE.25 Rd. to US 2 (about 7 miles). Turn left on US 2, go 25 miles and turn right on Danforth Rd. Go a half mile and turn left on N. 30th St., turn left on 6th Ave and then a right on N. 26th.

Things to do at Stony Point:

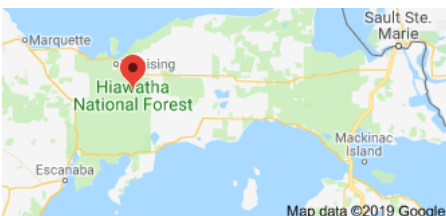
(all within 2 miles of the resort)

- RELAX!
- Swim, float, catch the waves and your vitamin D! Stony Point has 500 ft. of sandy bottom shores.
- Take a walk into town and enjoy lunch at the Nahma Inn (Closed on Monday).
- Fish off the DNR dock to the left of the DNR boat Launch $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from the cabins.
- Take your littles to the Nahma park
- Golf 9 holes at the Nahma Golf Course
- Launch your boat/kayak $\frac{1}{4}$ mile away at the DNR boat launch

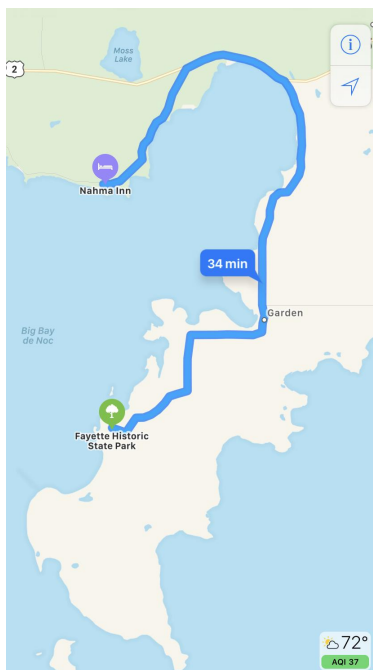

Fayette Historic State Park and Harbor

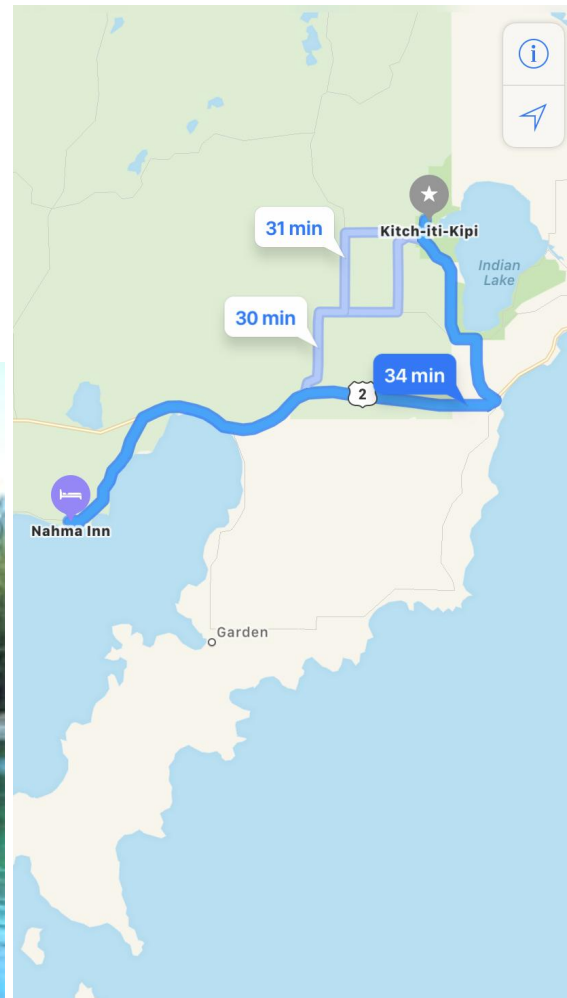

The 711-acre Fayette Historic State Park blends both nature and history. The park features a historic townsite, harbor slips, a boat launch, a beach and five miles of hiking and cross-country skiing trails with impressive views from the limestone cliffs that surround the harbor. The modern campground has some campsites with 50 amp service.

The [historic townsite](#), a once bustling iron smelting industrial community surrounding Snail Shell Harbor, features more than 20 historic buildings. A visitor center provides ample opportunities to learn about life in a 19th-century industrial town.



Big Springs "Kitch-iti-kiپی"



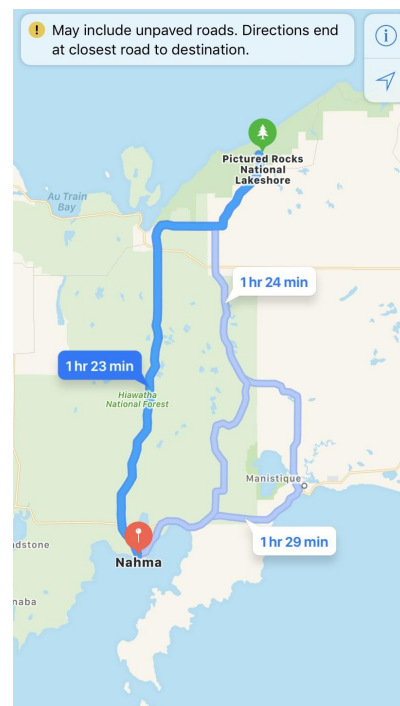
No visit to the area is complete without a trip to the Palms Book State Park. North on M-149, 12 miles from Manistique. Kitch-iti-kiپی is Michigan's largest spring. It is 200' in diameter, 42' deep and delivers 16,000 gallons of crystal clear water per minute. You can ride the raft for a beautiful view across the spring. A must see!

Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore, America's first National Lakeshore!

Unlike any other place on Lake Superior, Pictured Rocks offers the opportunity to explore miles of pristine beaches, hike nearly 100 miles of trails, view towering sandstone cliffs, and experience the serenity of northern woodlands.

In the spring, a new world appears along trails carpeted with the soft beauty of wildflowers. Summer gives way to warm basking days. Hues of orange, red, and yellow signal the wonder of change in autumn. In the winter, the raw windy beauty of snow frequents the days though periodically the snow blazes forth with sunlight.

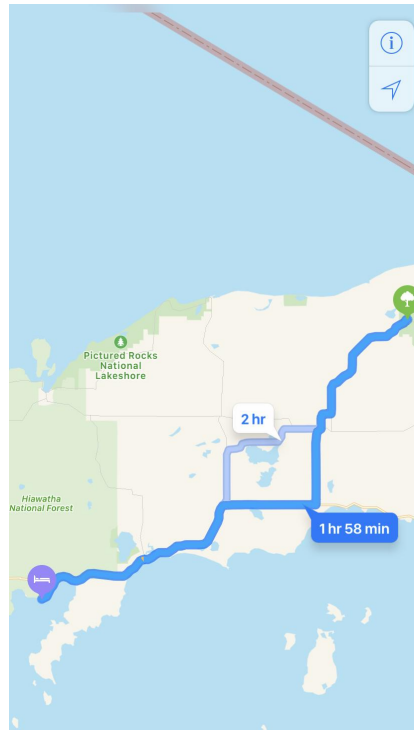
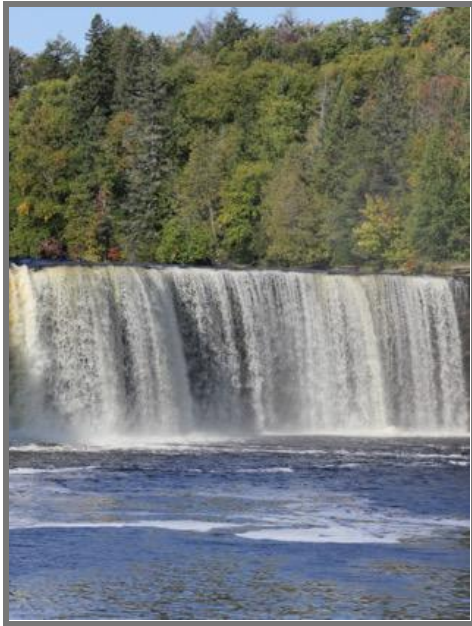

Tahquamenon Falls



Location: Tahquamenon Falls State Park, on MI-123, 20 miles west of Paradise, 25 miles north of Newberry, on the east end of the U.P.

This is the largest waterfall in Michigan, and in terms of volume it is in the top five for waterfalls east of the Mississippi. It is a bit out of the way. There are no other significant falls within a two hour drive, but the park offers lots of hiking and camping activities. If you happen to be [circling Lake Superior visiting waterfalls](#), make sure to visit this one.

There are three sections to the park: the upper falls, the [lower falls](#), and the rivermouth campsite.

The upper falls are the more scenic and are easily accessible. At 50 feet high, and 200 feet wide, the upper falls is one of the largest waterfalls east of the Mississippi River. It is a short walk from the parking lot to the falls, and there are several nice vantage points reachable by stairs. There is also a microbrewery at the upper falls, a gift shop and ice cream.

Naturally occurring tannic acids in the water give the falls their brownish tea color.

There is a trail between the upper and the [lower falls](#). It is 4+ miles, with some ups and downs, mostly through woods well above the river. The river is quite calm between the two falls, and there is not much rock to see.

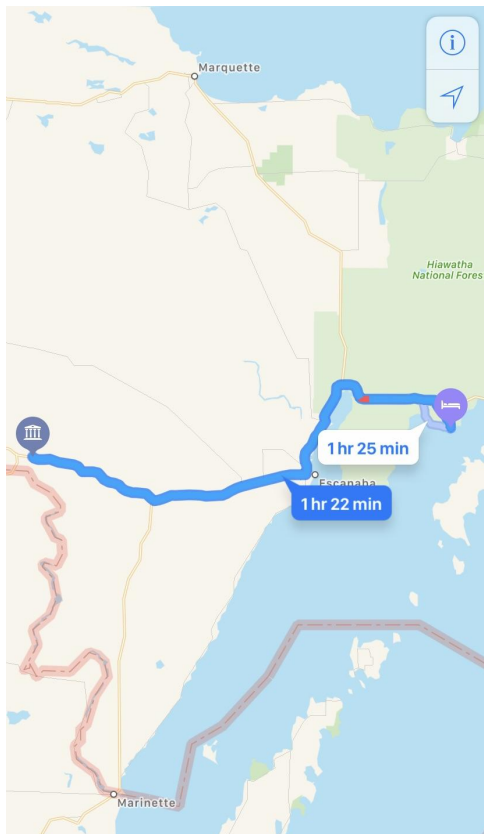

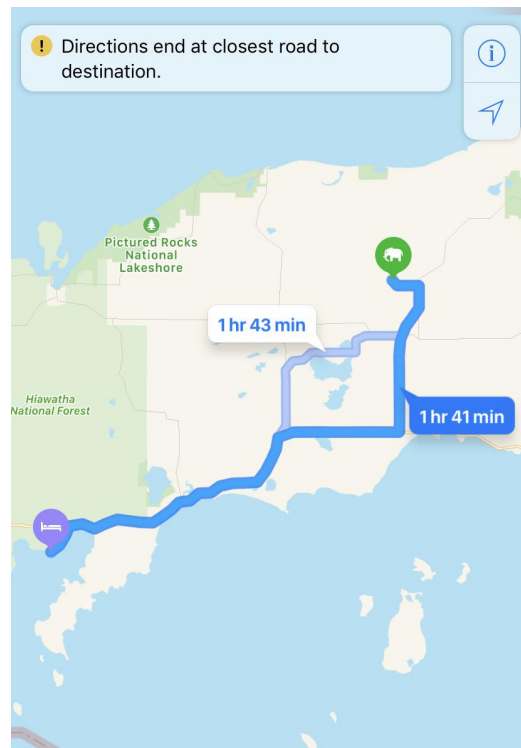
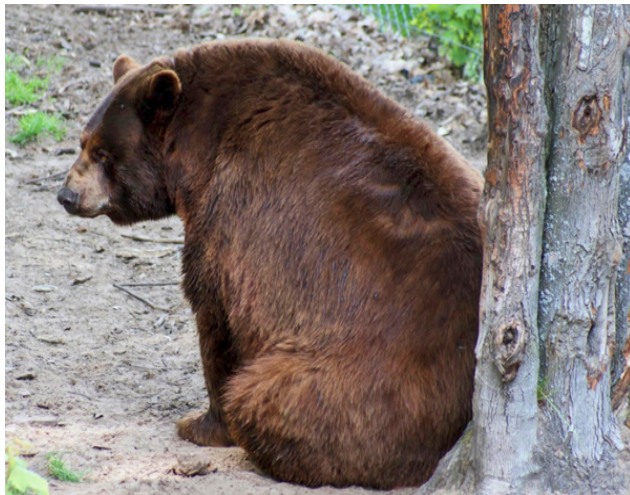


Oswald's Bear Ranch

The Bear Ranch is a healthy walk about and not a drive thru. We do offer a cart for the elderly or ADA guests. Here you will see the 40 American Black Bears in their unique and natural habitats. All of the large habitats are well maintained and safe for your viewing. We are handicap accessible. Bring your camera and get a picture of the cubs.

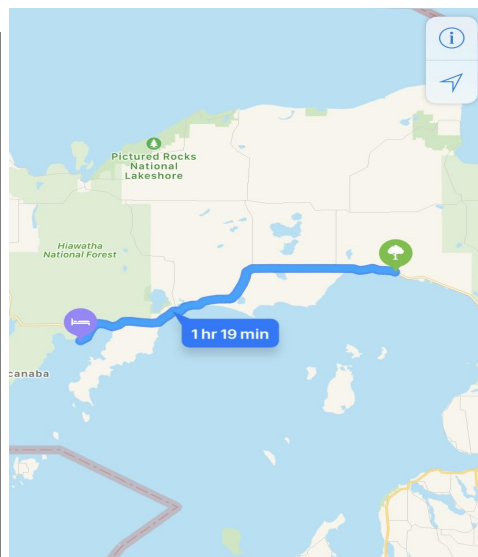


There is an elevated platform located at each of the four habitats. They offer a birds' eye view of the bears, their surroundings, and are great locations to see the bears at their daily 4:00 p.m. feeding time. Dean has made great efforts to accommodate all his guests and their expectations.

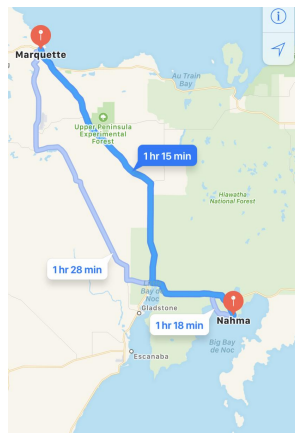
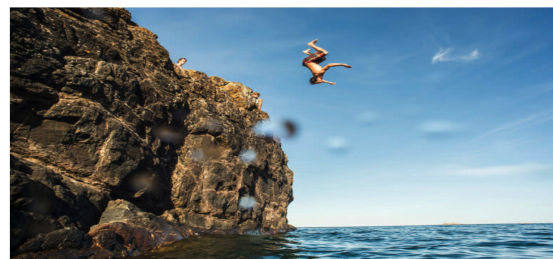


Marquette, MI



Spend a day in Marquette, MI!

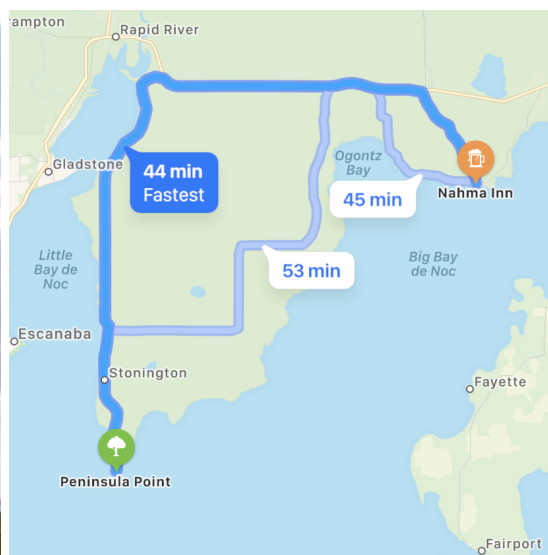
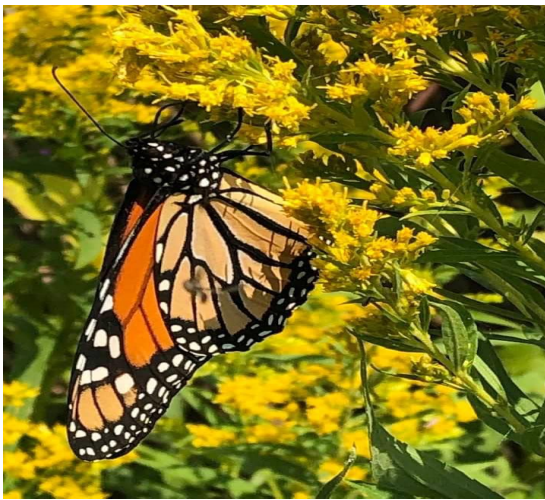

Stonington Peninsula- Butterfly Migration at Peninsula Point

Peak migration is from August to October!

Stonington Peninsula becomes the stopping-off point for thousands of Monarchs in late summer and early fall. You can experience the beauty of these butterflies at the Forest Service Day Use Area at the end of this peninsula, which separates Little and Big Bay de Noc. The best time to see the Monarchs in the trees is before dawn and right before sunset.

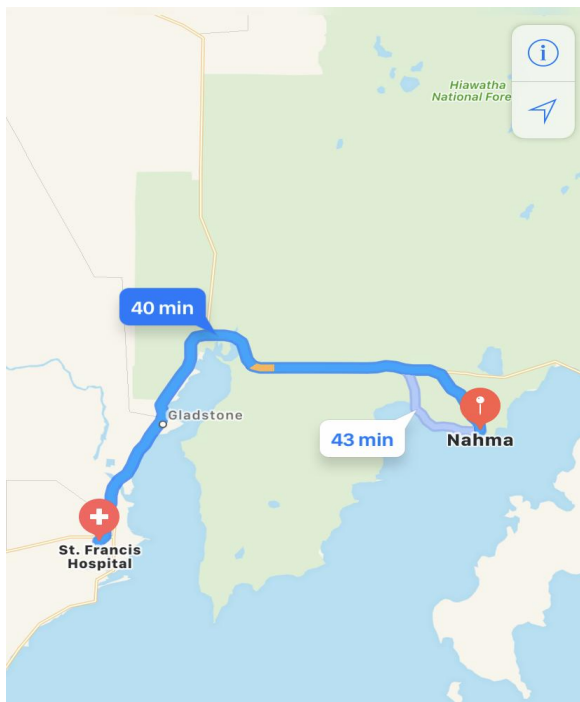
