She holds profound gratitude for those who go beyond the classroom to advance the principles of The American Legion and inspire the next generation through civic education and community engagement.

Across our communities, we rely on principals, guidance counselors, and teachers to foster participation in American Legion programs such as Badger Boys State, County Youth Government Day, the Oratorical Scholarship Contest, Americanism and Government Testing, the Law Enforcement Career Academy, Flag Education initiatives, and other Post-sponsored patriotic activities. Their leadership plays a vital role in instilling civic pride, patriotism, and leadership among our youth.

The Past National Commander Denise H. Rohan Educator of the Year Award was established through a generous donation by PNC Rohan, which is held in permanent trust by the Wisconsin American Legion Foundation. Only the interest earned annually from this trust is used to fund the award. This interest supports the recognition of educators who exemplify service, dedication, and leadership, helping to build stronger communities and a better future for all.

Award Purpose - This award recognizes an outstanding educator¹ who has made significant contributions to promoting The American Legion's Americanism and Youth Programs and who has fostered civic engagement, patriotism, and leadership development among students.

Eligibility and Nomination Requirements

- The Post's nominated educator should be someone who has worked directly with the American Legion Family to help students understand what it means to be an American. The nominee must actively support the Post's programs, such as Flag Education, Scouting, Badger Boys or Girls State, Oratorical Contests, and similar initiatives. Please describe specifically how they assist the Post.
- The candidate must currently be employed in grades K-12 at a public, private, parochial, charter school, or academy recognized by the Wisconsin Department of Education.
- The candidate must be an educator—such as a classroom teacher, instructor, or administrator—who has meaningfully advanced The American Legion's programs among students and staff.
- The candidate must be endorsed through a Letter of Recommendation from their school's Superintendent or Principal, attached to the nomination form.
- The Post-endorsed nominee shall be forwarded to the County Americanism Chair for further consideration. (Posts in Districts 4 and 5 will forward nominations directly to the district.) It is suggested that all County applications be **submitted to the District by May 1st.**
- The Department Americanism Committee will review all District-winning nominees and select the overall Department winner of this prestigious award.
- The selected Educator of the Year will be invited to the Department Convention, where they will be recognized with an appropriate award and an honorarium.

¹ In Wisconsin, an educator is defined as a professional working in a K-12 educational setting who holds a valid license issued by DPI. This encompasses classroom teachers, administrators, and pupil services professionals such as school counselors, psychologists, and social workers.
