The convention committee has put together an eclectic schedule of educational speakers, workshops and social events that will enlighten and entertain you throughout the weekend. From the rose show to heritage and sustainable roses to the latest developments in rose hybridizing to photo and arrangement workshops to celebrity rose trial judging and the "Taste of Louisiana" event there is something of interest for everyone!

Most of the programs and events will be held in the unique setting of the American Rose Center giving everyone the opportunity to see the headquarters of the American Rose Society, meet our enthusiastic, hardworking staff and view the amazing results of the Great Garden Restoration project. Just a whiff of the roses combined with the crisp scent of the vast Louisiana pine forest that surrounds the American Rose Center will make you glad you came! From the ARC we move to the Shreveport Convention Center for Saturday evening's rose auction and awards banquet. On Sunday, buses will depart from the Hilton Hotel for the daylong special "Roses & Steel Magnolias" excursion detailed in the accompanying article.

# American Garden Rose Selections 2023 Winners

American Garden Rose Selections was established to recognize and recommend the best garden rose varieties for the regions across the country through testing. The AGRS is a national rose trial that tests the same roses in gardens across the across the United States.

The 2023 winners were announced in January 2023.

**Brick House Pink** - Brick House Pink is a very compact Floribunda with fluorescent pink flowers that bloom continuously from spring through frost. It thrives in both containers and the landscape. For containers, pots, porch and deck. Star Roses & Plants Regional Choice Award, North Central, Northwest and Southwest.



**Brindella Pink Princess** — is a of tough rose selected for superior garden performance and show stopping flowers. It has a bushy growth habit, disease resistance and fragrant flowers. The roses grow about 4 feet by 2 feet. Suntory in Partnership with Dig Plant Company

**Petite Knockout** — this is the first-ever miniature Knock Out rose. With petite blooms it is ideal for a container. Mature plants are 18" tall. Star Roses and Plants.
