Community Health Representative

The Lytton First Nation (LFN) is currently recruiting for a dynamic, energetic, self motivated **Community Health Representative (CHR)** who is responsible for participating in the delivery of Community health, treatment, and surveillance programs to address health prevention, intervention and treatment needs within the community. As a member of the Health Care Team, the CHR is also responsible for liaising with patients, families, the community, and Health care providers to ensure patients and families understand their conditions and treatment and are receiving the appropriate care. The CHR is responsible for providing health education and monitoring the community health during epidemics and emergencies.

Responsibilities:

- Assist the Community Health Nurse
- Maintain regular contact (home visits) with the elderly and chronic clients while monitoring their physical health, nutritional status, requirements for medications, and 'lifeline units' to ensure home safety and appropriate emergency response
- Work closely with Home and Community Care staff
- Assist communities to plan and deliver culturally appropriate educational activities to raise awareness of diabetes, its prevention, self-management care and treatment
- Maintain current, accurate, and secure client files
- Provide the LFN Health Manager with monthly reports, updating the Health Manager on the health status of clients and their potential health needs
- Prepare an annual work plan to reflect the work that will be undertaken throughout the year and the anticipated outcomes of that work
- Liaise with LFN Health Workers (i.e., Home and Community Care, Community Wellness Worker, Mental Wellness Worker, Crisis Response Team, Assistant Programs Manager, Health Manager), and other involved professionals to share information and ensure appropriate services are provided to community members
- High School Diploma or equivalent
- Valid First Aid (Level 1)/CPR Certificates and up-to-date St. John Ambulance Training
- A minimum of 1 year of experience in actively delivering community health prevention and promotion programs (preferably within a First Nations context).
- Ability to pass and provide a current criminal record check
- Valid BC driver's license, a drivers abstract and access to a personal vehicle.
