Crisis Intervention Worker

The **Crisis Intervention Worker** is responsible for providing emergency intervention and support services to individuals, families, and the community on weekends and after hours. The incumbent will provide emergency support, recommend post-treatment services and strategies, and follow up with clients to ensure appropriate supports are in place and referrals have been made to appropriate service providers and organizations.

Responsibilities:

- Respond promptly to crisis situations and emergency calls, working with the crisis team to assess the situation and provide emergency support services to individuals, families, and community members
- Identify gaps in services to the Health Manager
- Maintain confidentiality of all records, materials and communication concerning clients
- Conduct follow up with clients (individuals or groups) to ensure they are receiving the support they require
- Works in cooperation with other community agencies and service providers on and off reserve (e.g., RCMP, Community Counseling Centre, Band and Public Schools, Community Health Nurses; Health Care Facilities.

Training and Experience

- Completion of training in the areas of suicide prevention, crisis intervention, critical incident stress debriefing, emergency counselling
- Valid First Aid (Level 1)/CPR Certificates and up-to-date St. John Ambulance Training
- 1 year of experience in actively delivering community health prevention and promotion programs (preferably within a First Nations context)
- Knowledge of Nlaka' pamux culture and history
- Ability to pass and provide a current criminal record check
- Valid BC driver's license, a drivers abstract and access to a personal vehicle with adequate liability insurance
