EVACUATION ALERT: Update 5:30 p.m. DAY 4
DATE: July 17th, 2022
LYTTON FIRST NATION RESERVES

Nohomin Creek K70580 fire, discovered July 14, 2022, affecting LFN and the TNRD.

BCEHS are moving additional resources into the Lytton area to assist where required. Has been stood up in the early stages of the event to gather information and support communities before the transition from response to recovery.

An estimated 1706 hectares; growth has been observed upslope on the west flank.

The Stein Valley Nlaka'pamux Heritage Park is partially closed and is being worked on to be fully closed

Thompson- Nicola Regional District (TNRD), BCWS, BC Parks, Lytton First Nation (LFN) and EMBC are meeting to discuss next steps for hikers in Stein Valley Park.

Eight structures lost on Lytton First Nation (LFN) land. Egress routes impacted for residents due to Lytton ferry closure. RCMP not able to secure evacuation order area. LFN and TNRD have coordinated around security needs at north and south end of fire

CN Rail has been assisting with moving supplies, which is vital for supporting members.

Lytton ferry closure is creating a challenge to transport supplies to the west side of the Fraser River.

Water donations have arrived from other communities and LFN EOC is working on distribution Working with the District of Lillooet, Lillooet Friendship Centre Society and Cache Creek to support evacuees.

Reception centers have been set up in Cache Creek and Lillooet to support evacuees. Lack of drinking. Water is becoming an issue; LFN has implemented a water advisory and set up a water refill station.

Also working to preserve food in fridges and freezers in homes that currently have no power.

Power has been lost to most of the surrounding areas on the Westside. Crews have worked diligently to deliver fuel, propane, and some generators to residents to minimize impacts to frozen goods

Parking at both sides of the Fraser at Hobo Hollow and the Spur.
