2022 RECAP

Thank you for making 2022 a memorable year for Operation Vet NOW Inc. (OVN), marking our fourth full year of operation and just the second without significant pandemic restrictions. Our progress this past year has us excited about the potential for what lies ahead for OVN. This small team of volunteers has done an incredible job of surviving the multiple challenges and staying-the-course to grow our outreach while strengthening programs and expanding the reach of our message of hope for our Veterans.

While we had numerous accomplishments in 2022, we would like to highlight a few that just stood out to us. The OVN Veterans Village (VVP) and Fallen Heroes Tribute Projects (FHT) continue to develop and meet their objectives, the VVP concept is becoming better understood, and we see more organizations engaging, opening new opportunities to reach outside our home base. The FHT has grown extensively, honoring over 100 fallen heroes last year, along with growing the number of Gold Star family participation in the project, words can't explain the change these families have made in the lives of our team. We will continue to enhance our Gold Star family events this year, and with partners like Legacies Alive & WCVMC, there is little doubt we will accomplish this.

The new Ambassador Athlete program has taken off beyond anything we imagined, the ambassador team has grown to nearly Veteran athletes in 10 different sports competing in multiple states, the ambassadors have expanded our reach immeasurably and have become a beacon of hope for many Veterans. These athletes are Veterans or currently serving members of the military who have overcome many personal challenges through participation in their sport, and other services for Veterans. The time and commitment of these ambassadors, and the work in spreading the message that help is available is what makes this program work; veterans helping veterans.

While these projects are exciting and possibly groundbreaking, they are logistically demanding, trying to get large scale event leaders to understand and adopt the concept the way it needs to be for full effectiveness is a process that must be built for slow growth. Large scale events bring large expenses, and we continue to weigh the return of investment to scale of reach.

Our ongoing goal in 2023 is to keep our overhead low by staying 100% volunteer run, no physical facilities nor utilities, keeping the focus on increasing our reach of Veterans and family members and accomplish all we did with just over \$40,000 in donations for the year. We believe at OVN the most valuable thing we can donate is our time to be there for our Veterans and their families, a key function of our outreach, and in 2022 over **2,000** volunteer hours when in to the OVN mission! We cannot put into words how appreciative we are of those who see what we do and donate directly to make it possible for us to continue and stay focused on the mission. OVN continues to grow due to our continually expanding community of organizations coming together to donate time, resources, and talent in our efforts to connect Veterans to care available and honoring those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom.

Thank you for wholeheartedly being a part of the OVN movement. We look forward to staying the course in 2023, and with you by our side we move forward with confidence.














Let's hear from a few of our Ambassador Athletes - Testimonials




RAISING AWARNESS VIA SOCIAL MEDIA
