

Fireplace & Chimney Safety Checklist

Make sure your home is safe, cozy, and ready for the season.

Before the Season Starts
☐ Have your chimney inspected and cleaned annually – hire a certified chimney
professional before the first fire of the season.
☐ Check the chimney cap and spark arrestor – ensure it's intact and free of debris.
☐ Inspect the flue and damper – make sure it opens, closes, and seals properly.
☐ Look for visible cracks in the masonry or firebox – repair any gaps or deterioration.
When Using the Fireplace
☐ Burn only seasoned, dry hardwood – avoid green wood or treated lumber.
☐ Use a fireplace screen or glass doors to contain sparks and embers.
☐ Keep combustibles at least 3 feet away from the hearth area.
□ Never leave a fire unattended – extinguish before leaving or going to bed.
Use proper fireplace tools (not hands) to manage logs safely.
Home Safety Around the Fireplace
☐ Install and test smoke & carbon monoxide detectors monthly.
☐ Have a working fire exting <mark>u</mark> isher ne <mark>ar</mark> by and know how to use it (PASS: Pull, Aim,
Squeeze, Sweep).
☐ Check for proper ventilation and clear vents of obstructions.
☐ Clean ashes safely – let them cool completely and store in a metal container outdoors.
Bonus Tip
☐ If buying or selling a home with a fireplace, include a chimney inspection – it's often
overlooked but critical for safety and insurance.
