## Season Greetings





Kwanzaa is a holiday invented in 1966 by Maulana Karenga (founder of the Black Power group "Us Organization") through which African Americans can connect with their heritage and culture. It's celebrated from December 26 through January 1, with each of the seven days focusing on one of seven core values, or Nguzo Saba. A candle is lit on each day, and on the last day, gifts are exchanged. Since

Since Kwanzaa is a cultural holiday rather than a religious one, it can be celebrated alongside Christmas or Hanukkah, or on its own, although Karenga wished for it to be celebrated instead of Christmas and Hanukkah, as he felt these holidays were simply symbols of the dominant cultures in

Decorate your home or the main room with the symbols of Kwanzaa. Put a green table-cloth over a centrally located table, and on top of that, place the Mkeka which is a straw or woven mat that symbolizes the historical foundation of African ancestry. Place the following on the Mkeka:

Mazao — fruit or crops placed in a bowl, representing the community's productivity. Kinara — a seven-pronged candleholder.

Mishumaa Saba — the seven candles which represent the seven core principles of Kwanzaa. Three candles on the left are red, representing struggle; three on the right are green, representing hope; and one in the center



is black, signifying the African American people or those who draw their heritage from Africa. Muhindi — ears of corn. Lay out one ear of corn for each child; if there are no children, place two ears to represent the children of

the community.
Zawadi — various gifts for the children.
Kikombe cha Umoja — a cup to represent family and community

unity.

Decorate around the room with Kwanzaa flags, called Bendera, and posters emphasizing the sev-

en principles. You can purchase or make these, and it's especially fun to make them with the kids. If you or your children enjoy making flags, try making African national or tribal flags in addition to the Bendera.

Practice the Kwanzaa greetings. Starting on December 26, greet everyone by saying "Habari Gani" which is a standard Swahili greeting meaning "what is the news?" If someone greets you, respond with the principle (Nguzo Saba) for that day:

December 26: "Umoja" — Unity

December 27: "Kujichagulia" —
Self-determination
December 28: "Ujima" — Collective work and responsibility
December 29: "Ujamaa" — Cooperative economics
December 30: "Nia" — Purpose
December 31: "Kuumba" —

Creativity
January 1: "Imani" — Faith.
Non-African Americans are also welcomed to participate in greetings. The traditional greeting for them is "Joyous Kwanzaa."
Light the Kinara daily. Since each candle represents a specific principle, they are lit one day at a time, in a certain order. The black candle is always lit first.

Have the Kwanzaa Karamu (feast) on the sixth day (New Year's Eve). The Kwanzaa feast is a very special event that brings everyone closer to their African roots. It is traditionally held on December 31st and is a communal and cooperative effort. Decorate the place where the feast will be held in a red, green, and black scheme. A large Kwanzaa setting should dominate the room where the feast will be held. A large Mkeka should be placed in the center of the floor where the food is placed creatively and made accessible to all to serve themselves. Before and during the feast, an informative and entertaining program should be

Traditionally, the program should involve welcoming, remembering, reassessment, recommitment and rejoicing concluded by a farewell statement and a call for greater unity.

During the feast, drinks are to be shared from a communal cup, the Kikombe cha Umoja, passed around to all celebrants. Give out the gifts of Kuumba. Kuumba, meaning creativity, is highly encouraged and brings a sense of self-satisfaction. The gifts are usually exchanged between the parents and children and are given out traditionally on January 1st, the last day of Kwanzaa

# U-M Health to acquire Lansingbased Sparrow Health System

University of Michigan Health is acquiring Lansing-based Sparrow Health System, the largest hospital system in mid-Michigan with six campuses in Charlotte, Ionia, St. Johns, Carson City and Lansing, along with 500 primary care providers and specialists.

The deal was approved Thursday by the University of Michigan Board of Regents. Sparrow Health System's board of directors signed off on the agreement in late November.

Pending regulatory approvals, the acquisition is expected to be completed in the first half of 2023. U-M Health spending \$800 million

"This agreement strengthens U-M Health's ability to provide quality health care in communities beyond southeast Michigan, expanding our mission as a statewide referral site for the most critically ill," Paul Brown, chair of the Board of Regents, said in a statement.

As part of the arrangement, Ann Arbor-based U-M Health will spend \$800 million over the next eight years in Sparrow's hospital campuses, funding facility projects, operations, and other "strategic investments."

Among them are renovations to the neonatal intensive care unit at E.W. Sparrow Hospital in Lansing and upgrades to services in cardiology, oncology, orthopedics and neuroscience, said Joseph Ruth, Sparrow Health System's executive vice president and COO, in a statement.

"This infusion of investment into Sparrow services will provide job growth and career development opportunities that would not otherwise be available to our caregivers," Ruth said.

Expanding footprint of U-M Health

The agreement includes Sparrow's Physicians Health Plan, an insurance plan that provides coverage to more than 70,000 members and 300 employers across the state, as well as a Medicare Advantage plan.

It was unclear Thursday whether Sparrow will keep its name or be renamed as part of the deal. "In the coming year, we expect to introduce

strategic updates to the Sparrow brand to appropriately reflect the relationship between our

care network that builds upon the strengths of the world-class U-M academic medical center



organizations," said U-M Health spokesperson Mary Masson.

With the addition of Sparrow, U-M Health will become a \$7 billion organization with more than 200 care sites across the state, including its main university hospital, C.S. Mott Children's Hospital, Von Voigtlander Women's Hospital, the Frankel Cardiovascular Center, Kellogg Eye Center, U-M Health West and the Rogel Cancer Center.

"For University of Michigan Health, this is an important step toward our long-term vision of a statewide system of highly coordinated care; a vision that Sparrow also embraces and is excited to build toward," said Dr. Marschall S. Runge, CEO of Michigan Medicine, dean of the U-M Medical School and executive vice president for medical affairs at the University of Michigan.

"Upon closing, U-M Health will create a clinical

and a very successful community-based health system. Together the two organizations will focus on bringing increased health care innovation to mid-Michigan and beyond."

This is the latest in a series of recent acquisitions and mergers among Michigan hospitals in the last year.

In January, the former Beaumont Health and Spectrum Health systems combined in a megamerger to form the new Corewell Health, the state's largest health system with 22 hospitals and more than 60,000 employees.

And the former North Ottawa Community Health System based in Grand Haven was acquired in October by Trinity Health. It became Livonia-based Trinity's ninth Michigan hospital. Article and photo courtesy of the Detroit Free Press.

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
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

Dear God, Creator of Heaven and Earth. The other night, I felt compelled to speak live on Facebook to my fellow Veterans and the families of my fellow thirteen fellow service members killed by the Islamic State-Khorasan terrorist.

I suggested that the Psalmist would have us invite the Lord's rod of comfort and staff of guidance as you navigate through, and the operative word is through, your grief and pain.

I further suggested that "you may feel as though your world is rashing in and crushing on your heart of flesh. You may feel abandon by

God, or you may no longer believe in God. However, I want to assure you that war and casualties of war are not God's plan or will for humanity. God's will and intent are for you to BE at peace in the middle of the world's craziness and amid life's storms.

My fellow Veterans and I are familiar with death and acquainted with sorrows that only time and faith can heal. During my 15 years in the US Navy Chaplain Corps, my duty was to inform families about their loved ones killed in action. Hearing the news of the thirteen killed is no less traumatic today than when I began. Yet, we volunteer to serve, knowing that we put our lives on the line.

I will be praying for you and invite you to pray for yourself. You are angry, sad, in denial, and, perhaps, asking 'why my husband, wife, son, daughter, sister, brother, friend?' God will not avenge anger for anger, disappointment for disappointment, denial for denial. God intimately knows about grief and sorrow. God feels what you feel. God is within you and has dispatched the Angels of Mercy and Wisdom to comfort and support you, especially now. You may feel too numb to speak. God hears your silent prayers.

I am also lighting a candle to honor you and your loved ones who've made the ultimate sacrifice. I pray you are blessed by these words of Healing and Hope."
