

John Lewis Warned Us About The Importance Of The Vote. We Should Listen.

Before John Lewis ascended to the place of the ancestors, he passed the baton to those who would continue his mission of social justice.

The former civil rights icon and Georgia congressman didn't want there to be any misunderstanding about his charge to those he left to keep running the race. In an [op-ed published in The New York Times](#) the day after his death, Lewis urged young activists to get into "good trouble, necessary trouble" — the kind of trouble that was his lifelong commitment once he signed on to the campaign led by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

In fact, Congressman Lewis' words poignantly echoed those Dr. King delivered to the striking Memphis garbage workers the night before he died. In MLK's now-famous "[I've Been To The Mountaintop](#)" sermon, he urged the Memphis garbage workers to keep fighting for justice, even as he preached that he might not get there with them. Congressman Lewis also acknowledged to his readers that he "may not be here with you." And he went on to implore them to vote — because, as he wrote, the vote "is the most powerful nonviolent change agent you have in a democratic society."

It's not surprising Congressman Lewis had voting on his mind as he faced his last days. Winning the right to vote for Black Americans had nearly cost him his life that day on Selma's Edmund Pettus Bridge where the then 25-year-old was beat by Alabama state troopers. The same vote also helped open up the doors of opportunity for him and millions more.

On this 38th anniversary of the Martin Luther King holiday, I am reflecting on the decades-long struggle to protect that vote, even as some stormed the Capitol to delegitimize the ballots of those who pushed back against voter suppression. They stood in long lines and organized to beat back old obstacles rebranded for these times. And they declared the racism of the president's multiple lawsuits only targeting

counties where voters of color are in the majority.

Congressman Lewis died three months before the November election day, in the midst of the president's lies about a rigged election. He didn't live to see the massive turnout which forced runoffs and later the eventual victories of Senate candidates the Rev. Raphael Warnock and documentary filmmaker Jon Ossoff. I can't help but see their historic wins as a spiritual link from the Rev. King's hand-picked disciple, Congressman John Lewis, to the Rev. Raphael Warnock — Lewis' pastor — and the now 33-year-old Ossoff, once a teen-aged intern for the congressman.

Ossoff acknowledged Lewis' posthumous blessing to [The Jerusalem Post newspaper](#), saying, "I know Congressman Lewis is looking down on us today and beaming with optimism."

But as optimistic as he was, Congressman Lewis was also clear-eyed about how disenfranchising millions of Americans is a threat to democracy. In his final op-ed, he warned, "Democracy is not a state. It is an act."

Days after the second impeachment of President Trump and a Capital overrun by insurrectionists, his last words are a wakeup call. Article by Callie Crossley of GBH

Voter Registration and Early Voting Available Now Only at City Clerk's Offices for the City Primary Lansing

Voters who need to register to vote, or update their voter registration, must register in-person at their local clerk's office now through election day. Proof of residency must be provided to be eligible to vote in the August 3rd City Primary Election. Newly registered voters can choose to receive an absentee ballot and vote it right there, or they can get a receipt and vote in their new precinct on Election Day. Early voting is still available to all voters using the absentee ballot process. The Lansing City Clerk's Election Unit, located at 2500 S. Washington, offers free parking, a 24-hour secure drop box, and is conveniently located on CATA Route #2. Walk-in early voting will be available at the at the following times: Monday – Friday, 8 am – 5 pm Wednesday 8 am – 7 pm Saturday, July 31st 11 am – 5 pm Sunday, August 1st 11 am – 5 pm LAST DAY, August 2nd 8 am – 4 pm (due to state law) Early voting is also available at the Clerk's City Hall Office, located on the 9th floor of City Hall at 124 W. Michigan Avenue from 8 pm – 5 pm Monday through Friday. There are two exceptions in Michigan election law that restrict early voting. On the day before the election, no absentee ballots can be issued after 4 pm, except in an emergency. Also, on Election Day, absentee ballots can only be issued to people registering to vote. At the website lansingvotes.com, Lansing City Voters may: • Request an absentee ballot to be mailed to their home; • Check on the status of their absentee applications; • View the list of candidates with their contact information; • Find information on military and overseas voting; and more! Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, absentee ballot applications have also been mailed to every active voter, making the voting process safer and easier for Lansing voters. Secure drop boxes, where absentee voters may drop off ballots at their convenience, are available within 1.5 miles of any Lansing resident. To find the closest location, visit lansingvotes.com or call the Clerk's Office at (517) 483-4131. Chris Swope Lansing City Clerk All absentee ballots must be received by 8 pm on Election Day. Voters returning their ballots by US Mail are advised to get them in the mail no later than Tuesday, July 27 per the USPS. Voters may also return their ballot to any City of Lansing Ballot Drop Box or either of the City Clerk's Offices by 8 pm on Election Day. "We have seen an increased turnout of almost 4,000 people requesting a ballot to vote from home compared to the 2019 City Primary. It is great to see participation in our City Elections has already surpassed the total number of ballots cast two years ago," said Lansing City Clerk Chris Swope, "As we get closer to Election Day, early voting is an excellent option with expanded hours on Wednesday evenings and the last weekend before the election at our South Washington Election Unit." For the City Primary, voters will narrow the field down to two candidates for the Mayor's office and for the Second Ward seat on City Council. The At-Large City Council race will be narrowed to the four candidates who receive the most votes. A milage renewal is also on the ballot. Public Safety Reforms:

Lansing should eliminate bail for misdemeanor crimes.

Qualified immunity for police officers should be rescinded by Lansing

Lansing should pass an ordinance creating a duty for police officers to intervene when observing force being used beyond what is reasonable.

Lansing should review all investments and eliminate any involved in the manufacture or development of guns.

Equity:

Individuals receiving assistance via Section 8 should have access to the City Attorney's Office to place rent in escrow when code violations have not been repaired.

Lansing should demand Individuals using CATA be able to get work between 4-5am. That is the time fast food outlets start work.

Lansing should ticket students for violations of law does not arrest them.

City investments designed to attract businesses should be monitored to determine the effect on minority communities. Attention should focus on whether money is being taken from services to pay for provisions to attract businesses.

Lansing should develop deserted schools/vacant buildings into lofts to house individuals without a home.

Lansing should establish a banking system for City residents unable to obtain financial services elsewhere.

Gun Violence

Lansing should open gyms for evening basketball games.

Lansing should make it illegal to have open carry in the City.

Lansing should require weapons being transported be locked in the trunk of the car.

Lansing should require insurance on guns.

Lansing should ensure public transportation is available to take residents to entertainment sites.





Bader of Truthout News, "efforts are underway to limit what libraries offer — especially when it comes to promoting racial equity and gender inclusivity.
