





MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. LUNCHEON SET

Martin Luther King Day is a federal holiday held on the third Monday of January. It celebrates the life and achievements of Martin Luther King Jr., an influential American civil rights leader. He is most well-known for his campaigns to end racial segregation on public transport and for racial equality in the United States.

What Do People Do?

Martin Luther King Day is a relatively new federal holiday and there are few long standing traditions. It is seen as a day to promote equal rights for all Americans, regardless of their background. Some educational establishments mark the day by teaching their pupils or students about the work of Martin Luther King and the struggle against racial segregation and racism. In recent years, federal legislation has encouraged Americans to give some of their time on this day as volunteers in citizen action groups.

Martin Luther King Day, also known as Martin Luther King's birthday and Martin Luther King Jr Day, is combined with other days in different states. For example, it is combined

with <u>Civil Rights Day</u> in Arizona and New Hampshire, while it is observed together with <u>Human Rights Day</u> in Idaho. It is also a day that is combined with <u>Robert E. Lee's birthday</u> in some states. The day is known as Wyoming Equality Day in the state of Wyoming.

Public Life

Martin Luther King Day is a federal holiday, but has slightly different names in some states. Non-essential Government departments are closed, as are many corporations. Some schools and colleges close but others stay open and teach their students about the life and work of Martin Luther King.

Small companies, such as grocery stores and restaurants tend to be open, although a growing number are choosing to close on this day. Some compensate by opening on Washington's Birthday instead. Recent federal legislation encourages Americans to give some of their time on Martin Luther King Day as volunteers in citizen action groups. Public transit systems may or may not operate on their regular schedule.

Background

Martin Luther King was an important civil rights activist. He was a leader in the movement to end racial segregation in the United States. His most famous address was the "I Have A Dream" speech. He was an advocate of non-violent protest and became the youngest man to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. He was assassinated in 1968.

In 1968, shortly after Martin Luther King died, a campaign was started for his birthday to become a holiday to honor him. After the first bill was introduced, trade unions lead the campaign for the federal holiday. It was endorsed in 1976. Following support from the musician Stevie Wonder with his single "Happy Birthday" and a petition with six million signatures, the bill became law in 1983. Martin Luther King Day was first observed in 1986, although it was not observed in all states until the year 2000. In 1990, the Wyoming legislature designated Martin Luther King Jr/Wyoming Equality Day as a legal holiday.







THE REALS OF JUSTICE

Recreational Marijuana in Michigan Part 1 By Ayanna D. Neal

I have been practicing law for over 16 years. I started my legal career practicing civil law. I handled child custody and divorce cases as well as contracts, and estate planning. For the past almost 15 years I have served this community as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney.



I have worked in all the courts in Ingham County – family, district and circuit courts. I began my career as an Assistant

Prosecutor working in the family court handling abuse and neglect and juvenile delinquency pre-trials and trials and mental health hearings. I then worked in all the district courts in Ingham County handling preliminary examinations for felony cases, and misdemeanor cases – pre-trials and trials, as well as traffic cases. I worked for years in the circuit court handling felony cases. I have also had special assignments as an Assistant Prosecutor. I've been a special prosecutor for domestic violence, arson, welfare fraud, criminal sexual conduct cases involving juveniles and currently serve as a special prosecutor for major drug cases in the Prosecutor's Ingham County Drug Addiction Response Unit and also handle civil forfeiture cases. I am also on the Criminal Sexual Conduct review team in which I review sex assault cases involving adults to determine if there is sufficient evidence to proceed and also provide input on how such a case should be han-

I have handled thousands of cases and have gone to trial on numerous misdemeanor and felony cases. I have specialized training in forensic interviewing of children, DNA, investigating and prosecuting criminal sexual conduct cases, domestic violence prosecution, arson investigations, civil forfeitures, drugs and drug trafficking, overdose deaths, as well as medical marijuana.

Speaking of marijuana, in the November election, Michigan voters voted for recreational marijuana. There are a lot of questions about the new law as to what it means for those who like to indulge in Mary Jane, reefer, weed, or whatever you like to call it. Here are some excerpts from the new law that addresses a lot of the questions I've been asked:

MCL 333.27954 states:

Sec. 4.

1. This act does not authorize:

(a) operating, navigating, or being in physical control of any motor vehicle, aircraft, snowmobile, off-road recreational vehicle, or motorboat while under the influence of marihuana;

(b) transfer of marihuana or marihuana accessories to a person under the age of 21: (c) any person under the age of 21 to possess, consume, purchase or otherwise obtain, cultivate, process, transport, or sell marihuana;
