MICHIGAN STATE SENATOR SARAH ANTHONY

Sarah Anthony is the first African American woman to serve as state representative in Lansing, Michigan as well as the first woman to serve a partial term in the Michigan House of Representatives. Not only has she served two terms representing Michigan's 68th House District, Anthony also served as Vice Chair of the Progressive Women's Caucus and the First Vice Chair of the Michigan Legislative Black Caucus. Anthony most recently accomplished another historic milestone by being "the first and only, and it's 2024" African American woman to have her picture hung in the capital. In 2023, she was nationally recognized for her efforts in sponsoring and reintroducing the Creating a Respectful and Open World for Natural Hair (CROWN) Act (2019) in the Michigan Legislature. Rightfully so, Anthony has been able to protect our right to wear our hair in styles most often worn by African Americans without discrimination. She stated, "Even in (2019), there were men and women and children who were denied employment,

denied healthcare and educational opportunities because of hair."

The CROWN Act, Senate Bill 90, now prohibits race-based hair discrimination, or the denial of employment and educational opportunities because of hair texture or protective hairstyles including but not limited to, braids, locs, twists, or bantu knots. Combating these stereotypes and negative judgments has raised national awareness of what many black women and men face daily that often bring about negative stereotypes and unjust discrimination. She has often publicly reported that "This systemic discrimination based on one's hairstyle has no place in Michigan." For her advocacy efforts in public service leadership, she was awarded the Michigan Civil Rights Commission's Elliot-Larsen Award on December 12, 2023. Senator Anthony has always fought for equal opportunity for all Michiganders. Her unique understanding of the discriminatory barriers, most often faced by black women,

all over the world have contributed to her success in partnering with other organizations. She continues to combat social injustice, advocate for expanding access to quality health care, strengthen higher education, uplift minority small businesses, and increase supportive services to our seniors. Anthony has collaboratively worked with several school districts, nonprofit community agencies, and business leaders to strive forward positive economic advances to fund and support these efforts for Michiganders. During her 20-year journey in public service, and as state Representative, her leadership, dedication, fearless drive, and compassion for her community has proven to be reputable and life-changing. Her talents and focal awareness of the African American experience has earned Anthony an exemplary foundation and recognition to continue to be the voice of black women today. STATEMENT FROM PRESIDENT BIDEN ON MARIJUANA REFORM

As I often said during my campaign for President, no one should be in jail just for using or possessing marijuana. Sending people to prison for possessing marijuana has upended too many lives and incarcerated people for conduct that many states no longer prohibit. Criminal records for marijuana possession have also imposed needless barriers to employment, housing, and educational opportunities. And while white and Black and brown people use marijuana at similar rates, Black and brown people have been arrested, prosecuted, and convicted at disproportionate rates.

Today, I am announcing three steps that I am taking to end this failed approach.

First, I am announcing a pardon of all prior Federal offenses of simple possession of marijuana. I have directed the Attorney

General to develop an administrative process for the issuance of certificates of pardon to eligible individuals. There are thousands of people who have prior Federal convictions for marijuana possession, who may be denied employment, housing, or educational opportunities as a result. My action will help relieve the collateral consequences arising from these convictions.

Second, I am urging all Governors to do the same with regard to state offenses. Just as no one should be in a Federal prison solely due to the possession of marijuana, no one should be in a local jail or state prison for that reason, either.


Third, I am asking the Secretary of Health and Human Services and the Attorney General to initiate the administrative process to


review expeditiously how marijuana is scheduled under federal law.

Federal law currently classifies marijuana in Schedule I of the Controlled Substances Act, the classification meant for the most dangerous substances. This is the same schedule as for heroin and LSD, and even higher than the classification of fentanyl and methamphetamine - the drugs that are driving our overdose epidemic.

Finally, even as federal and state regulation of marijuana changes, important limitations on trafficking, marketing, and under-age sales should stay in place.

Too many lives have been upended because of our failed approach to marijuana. It's time that we right these wrongs.

Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award in 2018.

Dr. Wilkerson-Johnson holds degrees from Wayne State University, the University of Michigan, and Ferris State University. She is an Adjunct Associate Professor at Lansing Community College and the owner of VWJ STEAM Ventures, LLC, dedicated to mentoring diverse students in STEAM disciplines.

Beyond her professional endeavors, she finds joy in music, literature, dance, yoga, and golf, while cherishing her roles as a devoted mother, wife, and member of her church and sorority.




